'Tom Sawyer' Opening Set

Children's Summer Theatre is now swinging into the last week of rehearsals for its performances of the musical "Tom Sawyer" to be presented on July 30 and 31 in the auditorium of St. Agnes High School on East River Road.

An amazing amount of determination and perseverance in making these daily rehearsals has been shown by many of the young performers, according to Sister Claudia, director of this summer project sponsored by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester.

There will be three performances for the general public, one at 8:15 on the evenings of Friday, July 30 and Saturday, July 31, and a matinee at 2:15 on Saturday, July 31.

Four of the high school girls in the play are from East Rochester and must bicycle in each day from there to Our Lady of Lourdes School where the rehearsals are held. They estimate that they will have ridden over 200 miles by the time of the opening.

Three of the boys are from Henrietta, and although they can get a ride in to Lourdes each morning, they must walk three miles from the end of the bus line to their homes on their daily return trips.

Even in these last days of whipping the production into the perfection Sister Claudia always demands of her casts, the young performers' enthusiasm does not wane, and they promise some excellent mid-summer entertainment next weekend.

All seats are reserved and tickets may be obtained at Trant's, Inc. on Clinton Avenue and at Our Lady of Lourdes Convent on Warrington Road, or by calling BR 1-1000. The cost is \$1.50 for adults and \$1.00 for children under four years.

Pilgrimage For Gypsies

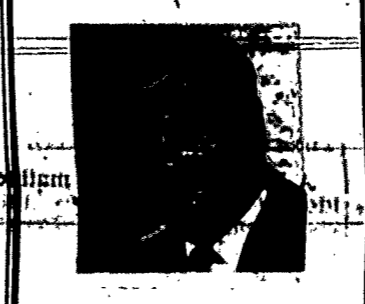
Paris — (RNS) — Several thousand French gypsies are expected to take part in a pilgrimage to Rome organized for them by the Bishops of France.
