Pope Asks Prayers for Children

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI delayed his usual Sunday recitation of the Angelus and benediction before thousands of pilgrims and visitors in St. Peter's Square to urge special prayers for the world's children.

While "many great and urgent things need our prayers," he said, "let us today think of that delightful part of the life of the church and of society—our boys and girls."

Noting that at this time of the year, many Catholic children receive first Holy Communion or Confirmation, the pontiff said, "let us think of those numbers of infant souls that are the glory and joy of the Church and of the family as the great treasure of society."

"Let us think," he continued, "of the many young people who are conscientious and strong, giving their lives for the glory of God to make their existence complete. We turn our thoughts and prayer today to all these fine and beautiful souls, trusting that their frailty may be protected and that we may find our own souls full of gratitude and admiration and hope for their innocence."

Ecumenical Rite Links Churches

Ocean City. — (RNS) — More than 1,200 Catholics and Protestants gathered here in a Protestant chapel for the area's first Service of Ecumenical Fellowship.

They heard two high-ranking churchmen—Catholic Archbishop Celestino J. Damiano of Camden and Methodist Bishop Fred Pierce Corson of Philadelphia—underscore the needs for further inter-religious communication and fellowship.

The ecumenical ceremony marked the first time that a Catholic priest had participated in a service in the Ocean City Tabernacle. This community was founded by Methodists, and the Methodist Tabernacle Association set guidelines in a charter for many of the sea shore resort's ordinances, particularly those dealing with Sunday sales.

Bishop Corson said, "the Protestant movement would not have been if a Pope with the spiritual point of view and holy consecration of Pope John XXIII had been head of the Church" in the era of the Reformation.

President of the World Methodist Council, Bishop Corson has been a delegate-observer at all of the sessions of the Second Vatican Council. During his stay in Rome he has had long talks with both Pope John and Pope Paul VI.

"The world is in dire need of an ecumenical movement that should not be static but dynamic and pulsating under God," Archbishop Damiano told the large interreligious congregation.

In holding that the achievement of Christian unity is the first purpose of the ecumenical movement, Archbishop Damiano declared, "Its prime purpose, according to Pope John, was to purge, reform and renew the church. This is just as true for Protestantism as it is for Roman Catholicism."

Pointing out that both Churches have built around themselves many barriers to ecumenism, Bishop Corson said, "There is still a long road ahead before arriving at a complete consecration of Christian unity."

He called Pope John "God's man of the hour" in describing his visits to Vatican City during the Council sessions.

"Ten years ago we never would have dreamed we could gather together in a service of this kind," he said. "But God has his own ways," the Methodist leader added.

The 1965 State meet will also spotlight three girls' events—the 100 and 440 and the 440-relay.

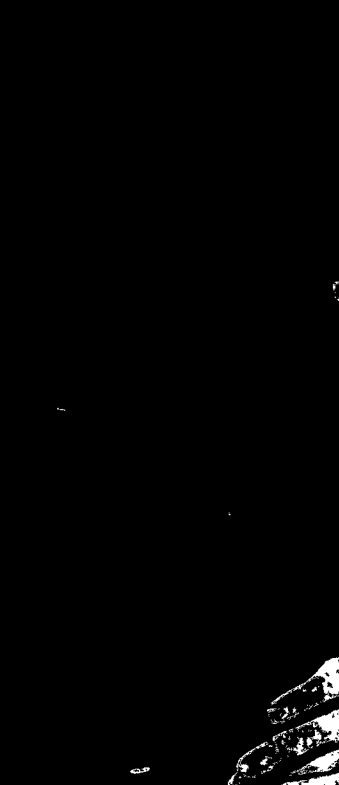
