French School Track, Field Programs Slated at Parker Field

Paris (NC) — The French Socialist party has thrown a bombshell into the presidential campaign plans of Gaston Defferre, one of its leaders, by asking that his platform call for abolition of state aid to church schools.

Defferre, 55-year-old mayor of Marseilles and member of parliament, is the only announced contender in the popular election for president of France next Dec. 5. He is a long-time opponent of President Charles de Gaulle, who presumably will seek another seven-year term.

Defferre in effect came out in favor of government aid for Catholic schools — thus against his party's traditional adamant stand — in a statement last December. He said he would not seek repeal of the Darange and Debre laws, which were passed in the 1950s and provided state aid for private schools for the first time.

Waverly Women Work for Missions

Mrs. Thomas Sheahan, of Court Joan of Arc, Catholic Daughters of America, Waverly, attended a convention of Catholic Daughters at Pittsburgh, Pa., in 1961.

She saw there a demonstration of the making of bandages for a Burmese leper colony.

At her home Mrs. Sheahan organized a group of women who met each week to make these bandages, using worn sheets. Worn shirts were used to fashion hospital gowns. Many small scraps were cut up and stuffed into dressing compresses.

A roller was obtained to speed the winding of the strips of sheets. Plastic bags of various sizes were used to package the finished articles.

Letters of appreciation were soon received from Father John G. Toner, M.S., of Bloomfield, Mass., for the boxes he received to be sent to Burma. The expense of sending the boxes was met by selling toy animals and aprons.

After Mrs. Sheahan's death in 1962, Mrs. John Mahoney of Waverly continued to organize the projects which are now carried on by nine women at the St. James School Hall.

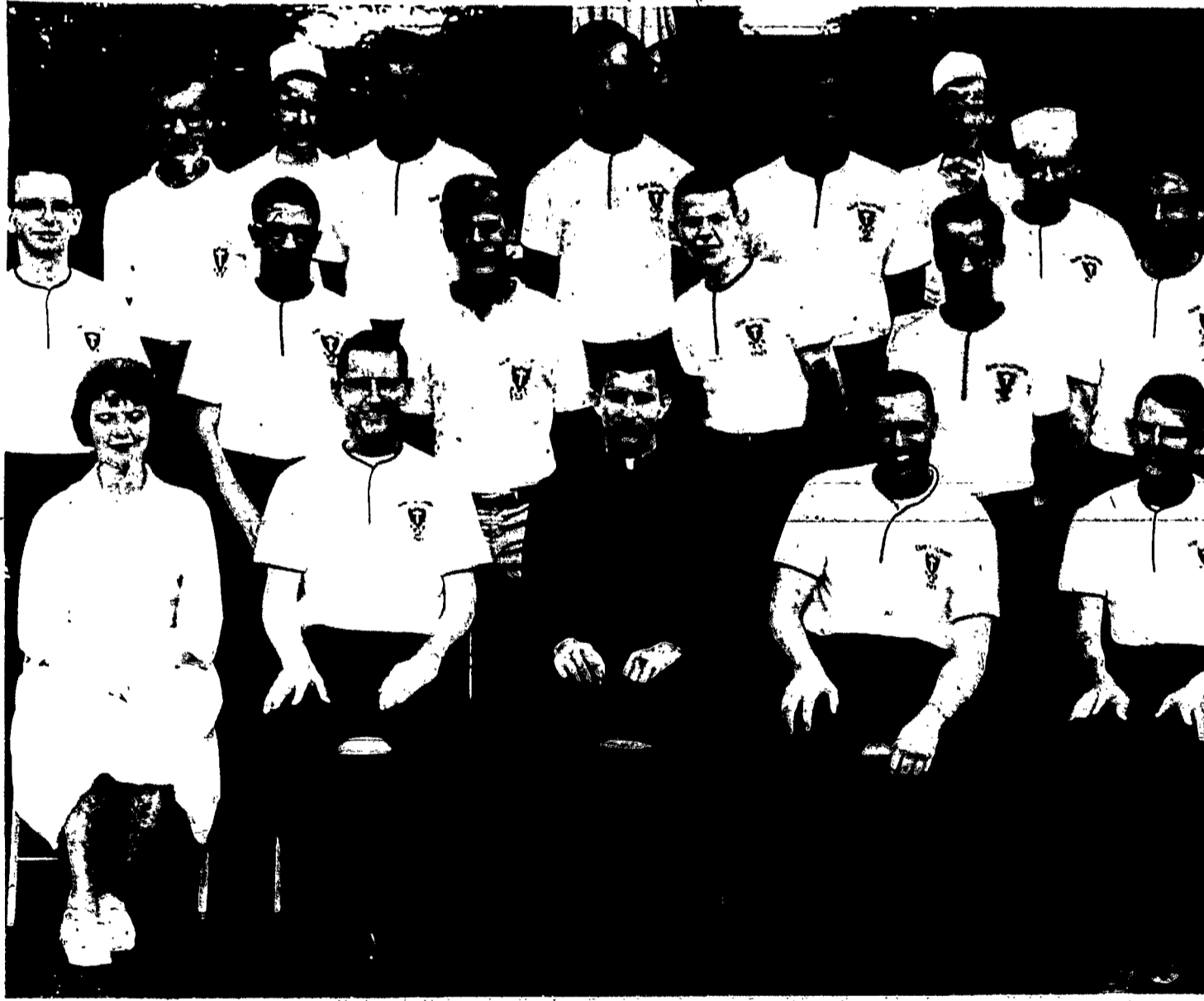
