NYS Track and Field Meet Set For Elmira Tomorrow

The fifth Annual New York State Track and Field Championship, set for Saturday at Parker Field, Elmira, is taking shape as repeat of last year's "East vs. West" battle.

Defending champion Long Island Striders, representing the East is preparing a 45-man team, but word out of Buffalo recently improves the West's chances.

Gardentown Track Club of Buffalo, State team champions for the first three years of the meet, has overcome its 1964 injury problem and has entered a star-studded veteran team.

The Buffalo contingent is led by Olympia trial competitor and former Cornell track captain Fran Smith and the 1963 State Meet Top Performer and former Western Kentucky star Chuck Gullio.

The 19-event State Meet will get underway Saturday at 5:30 p.m. with the first events and time trials scheduled for that time.

Main running events will get underway at 7 p.m.

Admission is \$1 for adults; 50 cents for grammar school children when accompanied by an adult, with pre-schoolers free.

On the feminine side of the ledger, Coach Jim Harden's Elmira Girls stand a good chance of outturning the Geneva Girls' defending champs.

Elmira lost by one point last year.

The girls will compete in the 100, 440 and 440-relay.

Mary Gorton of the Alfred Athletic Association will defend her 100-yard dash championship and Roxanne Lougee of Geneva will defend her 440 title.
