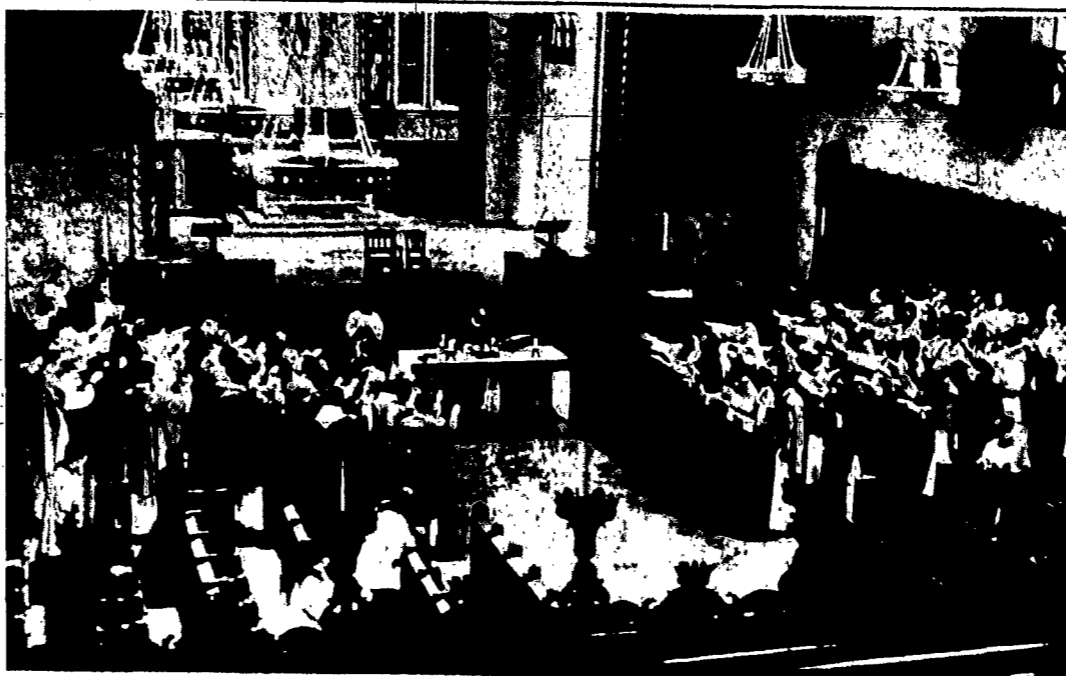


Religious Folk-Singers A Hit

Sixty Priests Say Mass Together

Huntington, N.Y. — (RNS) — A record number of 60 priests-concelebrate Mass at the Immaculate Conception Seminary in Huntington, N.Y., during a study week designed to help the clergy keep abreast of the Church's aggiornamento. At the altar is Father Henry J. Palmer of Syosset, N.Y. The week was attended by some 200 clergy, including diocesan and religious priests, seminary and college teachers, pastors and curates, and diocesan officials. It was held under sponsorship of Bishop Walter P. Kellenberg of Rockville Centre. Father Paul E. McKeever, a professor at the host seminary, said the week was "marked by genuine dialogue, open discussion, and realistic appraisal of the past and the formidable task facing the modern Church."

Polish Wall an Irritant

Warsaw — (RNS)—The city of Lomza, some 70 miles north-west of Warsaw, has become a new symbol of the ever-widening rift between the Catholic Church and state in this Communist-ruled country.

Involved is a dispute over a wall located on church property which city officials want to raze to widen the adjacent outside and improve traffic safety, but which Church officials insist must remain, at least under present conditions.

Meanwhile Argumenty, official organ of the Polish atheist societies, helped to focus national attention on the situation by publishing a special report in which it charged among other things, that the Lomza clergy were "more mili-

tant in their anti-progressive, anti-Communist attitude than any other priests in Poland."

According to reports filed, the wall in Lomza is about seven feet high and extends along part of a garden on the residence of Bishop Czeslaw Falakowski of Lomza. When negotiations began between the city and the Church last June, the city offered to pay 65,000 zlotys (about \$2,700) in compensation for knocking down the wall.

However, the reports said, Church officials insisted that while the city was free to demolish the wall, it must build a new one for the Church. The city, in turn, claimed that while it was willing to pay compensation it would be contrary to Polish law for it to provide a new wall.

Taking up the story from this point, Argumenty charged that when the city began expropriation proceedings, the Catholic clergy, with their bishop's approval, retaliated by placing a statue of the Virgin Mary in a niche near the top of the wall.

"This niche," the paper said, "had been empty since the war, but it now contains a statue which was consecrated with great ceremony, the sole intention being to obstruct the authorities in their expropriation move."

"The clergy are now organizing a campaign, saying that the sole aim of the authorities is not to widen the road, but to remove the statue of the Virgin Mary, which has become very popular with the local faithful and is always surrounded by flowers."

Argumenty claimed that the local clergy was compiling a "black book" containing the names of all those who favor the road-widening plan and, as a consequence, the removal of the statue.

"These people," it said, "are being visited by priests who try to persuade them to change sides."
