**Adult Sodalist**

**Convert Makes Fine Catechist**

(This is the second in a series of articles on Rochester area adult Sodalist, written to show how their Sodality commitment is being expressed in their daily lives.)

Eight years ago, public health nurse Elizabeth Klemm, 8301 Ridge Road in Brockport, entered the Catholic Church, after a "do-it-yourself" instruction course. Since then, she's devoted much of her time to instructing others.

The self-taught instructions came about in this way:

In 1957, Betty (which name she prefers) was working in Fort Worth, Texas. (She is a local girl, however, and did her nursing training at Highland Hospital in Rochester.) She was trying to work out her own personal religious philosophy, and reading the Bible was her main avenue.

Her reading evoked many questions about the nature of God, the Divinity of Christ, etc. She decided to consult a clergyman.

It happened that the nearest church was a Catholic parish, run by Franciscan Fathers. The pastor was a hardworking, over-extended priest, so after answering Betty's questions for an hour, he gave her two books on "The Catholic Faith" saying:

"Come back in a month, and we'll see how you are doing."

In a month, Betty came back. She had done her homework well, but was on the point of moving from Fort Worth to a new job in Tennessee. She told the busy priest that she had decided to become a Catholic, but was moving from the city soon.

He said, "Let's see how much you understand."

After 90 minutes of friendly interrogation, the pastor must have been impressed, because he said:

"I'll receive you into the Church here, but you must promise to take a full course of instruction when you get to Tennessee."

After instructions when she got to her job. She has never stopped learning since.

Returning to Brockport in 1959 to become a public health nurse, Betty heard of an Adult Sodality being formed.

"I wanted to live the most complete Christian life I could," she says, "and the Sodality seemed to offer a solid spiritual formation."

Under the direction of Father Michael Daly, then assistant pastor at Brockport's Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church, the Adult Sodality there was definitely a working group.

Through the Sodality, Betty Klemm has taught religion classes, worked in the Parent-Educator program, and helped her pastor Father Edward Lintz set up a home visitation program for the sick in the parish.

Father Daly is now full time moderator of the Newman

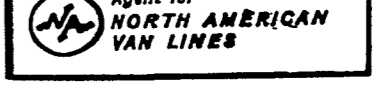


