Mass, Minister for Mixed Marriages

Mass may now be celebrated at mixed marriages in the Rochester Diocese and a minister will give a blessing to the couple at the home following the church ceremony.

Bishop Kearney, in accord with a recent decision of the Vatican's Holy Office authorizing a change in the Catholic Church's laws on mixed marriage, sent the following direc-

tive to priests of the Diocese this past week:

- 1) The bride and groom (and where customary, the maid-of-honor and best man, will occupy special pews in the sanctuary, whether Mass is celebrated or not.
- 2) Mass may be celebrated in connection with a mixed marriage when both parties request

it. The Mass will be either the nuptial Mass or the Mass of the day, in accordance with the rubrics. Pending further instructions, the nuptial blessing may also be imparted during the Mass.

3) A minister may be invited by the couple to recite a prayer or impart a blessing to them at the home of either party after the Catholic ceremony.

Perpetual Help Tour in 1966

The "Journey of Fulfillment" of participants in 1966 from European travel program sponsored by the Redemptorist Fathers to celebrate the 1966 centennial of the return to public veneration of the original painting of Our Mother of Perpetual Help is reportedly gaining enthusiastic acceptance by Catholics in the United States and Canada.

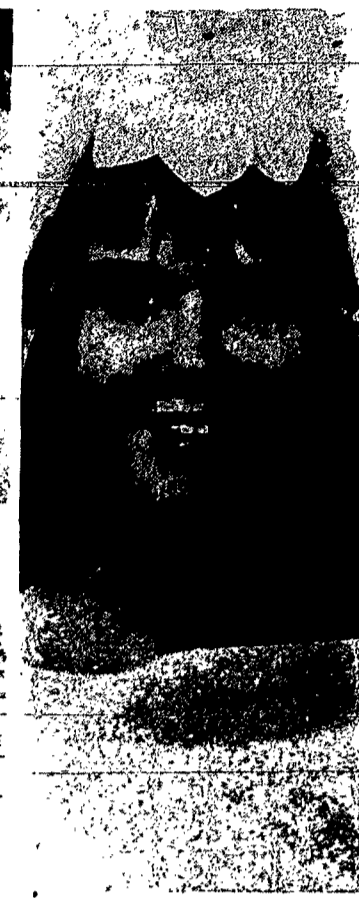

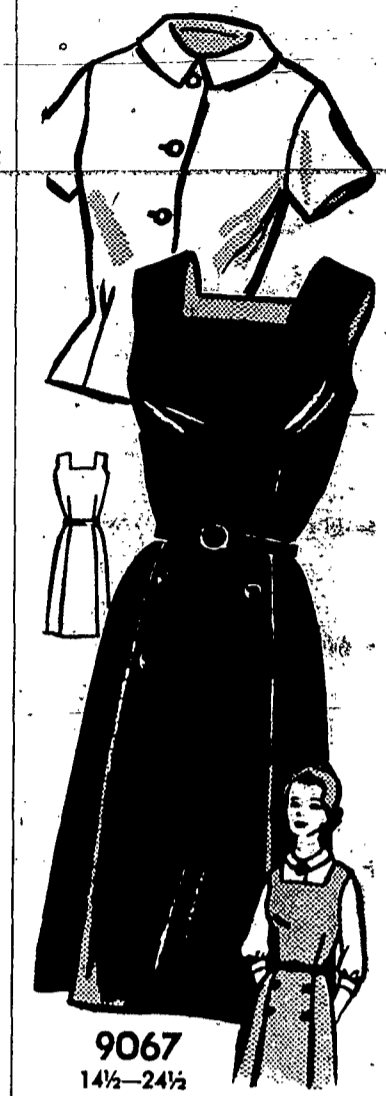
