Bible Rites Prove Popular

Retreatants this year at Notre Dame Retreat House more actively participate in the retreats by means of the Bible Service according to Father Richard Moran, retreat director.

These Bible Services consist of scriptural readings from the Old and New Testament and are done by the retreatants themselves. And with his explanation, the commentator, a retreatant, gives the retreat group the key which opens up the meaning of God's message in the particular passages read. The priest's homily at the end applies the message of God's Word to our own day, centering it all on Jesus Christ who is the Last Word of God.

"This year's retreat theme," said Father Moran, "is on the Power of God's Word." He added: "In past years, all preaching tended to concentrate on the seven sacraments or on moral practices, and we put little emphasis on the Sacrament of God's Word—And it is because of the power of God's Word that our seven Sacraments have meaning."

The Rosary is the Catholic Church's most ancient "biblical devotion," Bishop Kearney told young retreatants at the Cenacle Convent Retreat House Sunday morning.

He said meditation on the Rosary's mysteries "takes us to the heart of the New Testament, the life, sufferings and triumph of our divine Lord." He advised the retreatants, high school girls from several Rochester area parishes, that they should carry the Rosary with them at all times and say it daily.

The Bishop said when doctors pronounced President John F. Kennedy dead in Dallas, Mrs. Kennedy was asked if she wanted a Rosary placed in his hands. She said yes and that they would find one in his pocket where he always carried it.

German Prelate Proposes Protestant Patriarch

Nuernberg—(NC)—The archbishop of Salzburg has proposed the establishment of an "Evangelical (Lutheran) Catholic patriarchate" by which the Lutheran church would be accepted as a separate branch of the Catholic Church.

In an interview published in the Catholic journal Der Feuerreiter, Archbishop Andreas Rohrer of Salzburg said there are precedents for such an arrangement. "Individual patriarchates were founded to assist the reunion of several Oriental-rite churches with Rome. There is not reason why something similar cannot be worked out for the Lutherans," Archbishop Rohrer stated.

He stressed that certain requirements would have to be met before such a patriarchate could be set up. He said that agreement would have to be reached on the "foundations of the faith," and on the existence of a "validly consecrated hierarchy. But once this is accomplished, he said, it would be possible to envisage the administrative, ritual and disciplinary tradition of Lutheranism accepted as a juridically established branch of the Roman Catholic Church.
