

# Nuns Ask Council Voice

Lafayette, La.—(RNS)—Dr. James R. ## Bishops Oppose U.S. Funds for Birth Control

"No one questions the right—even the desirability—of expanded government-sponsored research into the problems of human reproduction. However, at the moment that government presumes to give advice in this delicate area, it opens the door to influencing the free decision of its citizens. And from influence it is only a short step to coercion."

"Especially when economic factors are involved, like welfare payments, the slightest attempt to 'guide' an applicant may be magnified by fear into an unspoken threat to conform or else."

Cautioning against expecting a change in Catholic teaching on contraception, the archbishop quoted condemnations by both Pope Pius XI and Pope Pius XII.

"He noted that Pope Paul VI, in establishing a special study commission on population, said, 'So far we do not have sufficient reason to regard the norms given by Pope Pius XII in this matter as surpassed and therefore not binding.'"

At the same time he noted the existence of a number of Catholics classified as experts who, while asserting that they do not officially speak for the Church, nevertheless have not hesitated to try the case in the newspapers, in periodicals and on television."

The archbishop said such activities had raised "false hopes" in some quarters and persuaded some congressional committees and public bodies that the Church's attitude was changing. He said he felt obliged to speak out to counter this impression.

The archbishop urged his listeners "not to allow preoccupation with the techniques of birth limitation, even those which are not of themselves immoral, to distract us from the higher duty of trust in God."

"Which one of you in this cathedral has not known at some time the terrifying worry of being out of a job or being hit by heavy hospital bills? Where are those worries today?"

"And if next week you were asked to sacrifice one of your children to ease the 'population explosion,' which one would you choose?"

Denver—(NC)—Representatives of 18,000 nuns in the United States have unanimously supported a historic resolution proposing that Sisters have a voice in Vatican Council deliberations which affect their lives.

The proposal, which will be submitted to the bishops of the United States, the Sacred Congregation of Religious in Rome, and to the Vatican Council, culminated the five-day meeting of the Conference of Major Superiors of Women here.

It states: "The Conference of Major Superiors of the United States requests that Sister representatives be asked to serve as permanent, consultative or acting members of the Sacred Congregation of Religious, of the Commission for the Revision of Canon Law, and of any post-conciliar commission that may be set up for implementation of acts of Vatican II in regard to Religious."

Sister Mary Luke, conference chairman, speaking on behalf of more than 400 major superiors from 44 states, said there is "a serious concern" on the part of leaders of nuns that "women should have something to do with the regulations that bind them."

Sister Luke, the first American woman to serve as a Council auditor, urged that this request for representation of nuns within Church regulatory bodies be taken as "meaningful" and given "a respectful hearing."

She said she was "very optimistic" that the resolution would be favorably received in Rome and elsewhere, basing her optimism on what she called "a fine, open attitude" on the part of the world's bishops.

In announcing the resolution, Sister Luke observed: "Certainly, we hope to see lay women on these commissions some day, too. I think the majority of council Fathers would favor this."

Future meetings of major superiors "may issue annual statements on some pressing issue or key topic, similar to the annual statements of the bishops of the United States."

## Reorganization For Parishes

Sao Paulo, Brazil—(NC)—Some bishops of Brazil want to discard the customary method of creating parishes along geographical lines, and establish them as "communities of interest" instead.

The idea was proposed by the 18 bishops of the province of Sao Paulo when they met here to draw up a five-year plan to present to the National Conference of the Bishops of Brazil when it convenes in Rome during the fourth session of the Vatican council.

Still in a tentative stage, the plan envisions the creation of workers' parishes and farmers' parishes, rather than parishes based only on geography.
