The 18-minute projection depicts the history and expansion plans of Nazareth and St. John Fisher Colleges. It also dramatizes the reasons and need for the proposed construction of a House of Studies adjacent to the St. John Fisher campus for pre-theology students.

Narrators include Bishop Kearney and the Very Rev. Joseph L. Hogan, S.T.D., first rector of the proposed Becket Hall to be erected for seminarians who will take their four years of college courses at St. John Fisher College.

Produced through the Joint College Fund campaign headquarters, the film has been offered on a "first-come, first-served" basis. It was viewed by 19 groups this week. Geneva—Mrs. Thomas A. Kane of 36 Genesee St., a widely-known Geneva, and the mother of the late Judge Thomas A. Kane, quietly observed her 98th birthday Thursday, Sept. 16.

Celebration of the event was in the form of a small supper in her home. Present were her two nieces, May O'Brine and Mrs. Geraldine Lappeus, both of Auburn; and her cousins in Geneva.

Mrs. Kane was born in Aurora, Cayuga County, the daughter of Cornelius and Alice Dwyer. She received her musical education at Wells College, Aurora, and finished at the Old Cayuga Lake Academy at Aurora.

She was married to Thomas A. Kane in St. Francis de Sales Church in Geneva on Oct. 29, 1890.

Mrs. Kane came to Geneva when she was about 18 years old and became organist of St. Francis de Sales Church, a position which she held for more than 50 years. She was honored with a citation for her work by the late Rt. Rev. Msgr. Walter J. Lee, pastor of the church.

She was prominently identified with church and civic organizations and the Geneva General Hospital, Newark State School, and the Child Welfare Board of Ontario County. She also did war service with the Geneva Carle unit, American National Red Cross and was active later in USO work.
