An examination for the position of Police Officer in the City of Rochester will be held Dec. 1 according to Police Chief William M. Lombard. Closing date for filing of application is Nov. 4.

The salary range is \$5,962 to \$7,028.

Qualifications set forth by Deputy Chief Henry H. Jensen of the Community Relations Division are:

Applicant must be between 21 and 29 years of age, at least 5'8" in height, and in good health.

Applicant must be a resident of the City of Rochester or one of the five contiguous counties. They are Orleans, Genesee, Livingston, Ontario, or Wayne.

He must be at least a high school graduate or hold an equivalent diploma from the New York State Department of Education.

Testing will include a written examination, medical and physical agility examinations, a background investigation and psychological-psychiatric tests. Only those applicants who are successful in all the examinations will be selected.

Charity Ladies List Assembly

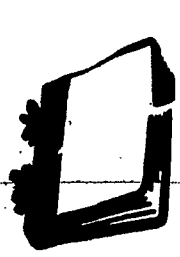

Religion Classes During Mass

St. Anne's Church, Rochester, has something new on Sunday mornings. During the 10 o'clock Mass parents may have their four and five year old children attend religion classes while their parents attend Mass.

In these classes the four year old children will learn the Sign of the Cross, the 'Angel of God' and a morning offering prayer. They will hear how God loves them and the story of Creation. To prepare for the coming of the Christ-Child they will make Advent wreaths along with receiving a coloring picture each week that illustrates the story they had heard in class.

The five year old class will review their prayers and the Sign of the Cross and learn the Hail Mary and the Our Father. They will hear about the Mysteries of the Rosary while making their own Rosary. During Advent weeks will be made for the Child Jesus in which they will put straw, earned by their kind deeds. In the second semester they will learn about the Mass.

This program, the first in this area, has met with much enthusiasm both by parents and children. The children enjoy learning about their religion at a level they are able to understand and the parents enjoy hearing Mass without the distraction of their small children. At present the classes are full with 38 children registered and a waiting list forming.

The classes are not intended to deprive parents of their rights and duties regarding the spiritual education of their children. They are simply a supplement to the spiritual training received in the home. Parents are asked to participate by reviewing the lessons during the week with their children. To give evidence of parental involvement there is a registration fee of \$5.00 per year.
