Requiem For Junior

Nancy Ann Ewing, a junior at Cardinal Mooney High School, died of a brain tumor on Tuesday, September 14, 1965. Bishop Kearney celebrated her Requiem on Friday morning, Sept. 17, instead of the scheduled Mass of the Holy Spirit at the high school. The Bishop addressed the students in two groups before and after the funeral.

The school band in their red and gray uniforms, acted as a guard of honor for Nancy since she had been a proud member of that group. Many faculty members with the whole junior class marched in procession to St. Charles Church to attend the funeral.

In a moving sermon, the Bishop spoke of Nancy as being the chosen one, the representative of Cardinal Mooney at the throne of God. Just as when a student who has conscientiously prepared each day's work is

not fearful of a final examination, the Bishop pointed out, so Nancy whose virtues bespoke her daily dedication could meet her God courageously.

A spirited student during her two years at Cardinal Mooney, Nancy was not only a member of the band but was also active in the Sodality and C.S.M.C. Church, home and school were Nancy's life, according to her closest associates.

Besides her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Ewing of 177 E. Union Circle, Greece, Nancy is survived by three brothers and a sister. One brother, Robert, is now a freshman at Cardinal Mooney High School.

Landmark Passes

Another Elmira landmark passed into history recently with the demolishing of the former Notre Dame convent on Lower Maple Avenue. The 28 Sisters of Mercy who staff Notre Dame High School moved into the new convent in mid-August.

Originally constructed in 1791, the former convent was one of the oldest homes in the area. In 1825 it passed into the hands of the Graywood family under a grant from Governor DeWitt Clinton, and in 1903 was acquired by the late Gabe P. and Emma Smith of Chemung, who rebuilt it in 1906.

The property was purchased in 1946 by the late Thomas P. McCann, who modernized and renovated the fifteen room structure. In June, 1962, it was acquired by the Sisters of Mercy who enlarged the house with ten more rooms to serve as a convent for the faculty of Notre Dame High School.

The new convent, begun in October, 1964, is about two-thirds finished and is scheduled for completion in December, 1965. It will provide accommodations for thirty-four Sisters. At present the Sisters are using chapel and library facilities in the school, pending completion of the final wing of the new building.

Patron Drive Begun

Credo, Notre Dame's yearbook, began its annual patron drive on Tuesday, September 28. Sister Mary Christopher announced that the goal for Credo of '66 is \$8,000. A business day has been scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 2, on which specially assigned students will canvass the downtown area to ask store managers to support the Credo.

The drive will end with a dance on October 8 after the football game with Coming East.

Plan Stamp Drive

The C.S.M.C. Catholic Students' Mission Crusade, had its membership recruitment on Sept. 20. Paul Zoltowski, president, announced that the first project will be the stamp drive.

Aquinas Debate Team To Be Honored Oct. 13

The secretary of the National Forensic League, Bruno E. Jacob of Ripon, Wisconsin, will be at Aquinas Institute on Oct. 13 to take part in a school assembly honoring the Aquinas debate team which won the National Championship last June in Omaha, Neb.

According to Gordon J. DeHond, debate coach, Jacobs will award a citation to Aquinas for being the "most active and most successful" chapter of the National Forensic League in New York State.

Members of the winning team representing Aquinas were James Hendrick and Thomas Farrell, both now attending Canisius College on scholarship.

During the past year Aquinas debaters captured the New York State championship title in Oswego; the State Tournament Award for most students in final rounds of oratory and debate and the New York State Sweepstakes Award for the largest number of students active in the forensic arts.

DeHond, who is the director and general supervisor of the forensic program at Aquinas, is assisted by Charles Delaney, C.S.B., associate coach of the varsity debaters. Paul O'Connor, C.S.B. is junior varsity coach and the freshmen are directed by Sean Murray and Vincent Dulock. C.S.B. Murray was an outstanding orator while a student at Aquinas.

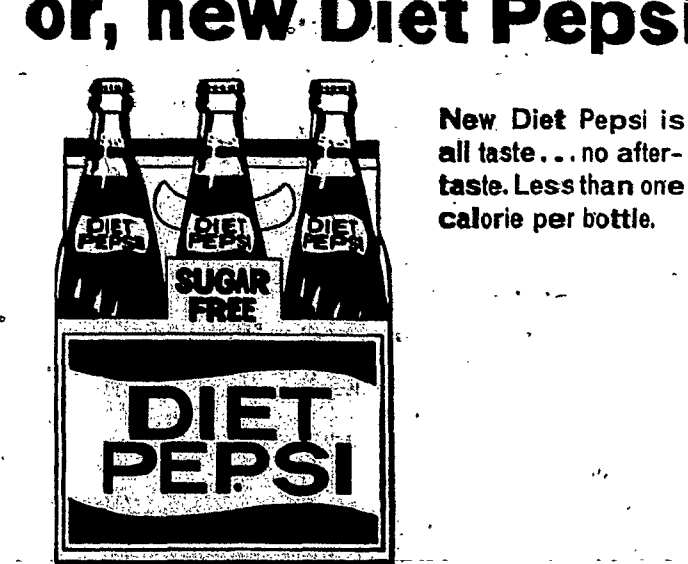

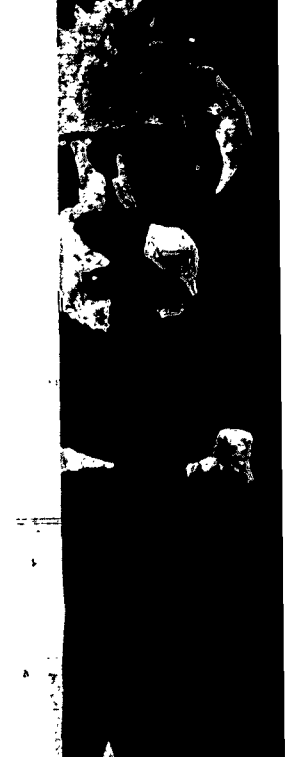
