Alumni to Aid Fund Drive

Bishop Kearney will address more than 400 alumni of Nazareth and St. John Fisher Colleges Thursday, Oct. 21 at 8 p.m., to launch alumni participation in the current Joint College Fund Campaign.

Other speakers at the alumni JCF kickoff, scheduled in Kearney auditorium in the St. John Fisher College administration building, will include Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, president of St. John Fisher, and Sister Helen Daniel, president of Nazareth.

Committee members will receive their worker kits and then will adjourn to the new St. Basil Hall for a tour of the building and a social hour.

On the following day they will begin visits to fellow alumni for two-year pledges toward the \$9 million joint college campaign goal.

It has been announced that a unit of contributions to the Joint College Fund, no matter through which committee they are obtained, will be credited toward the quota of the parish with which the donor is affiliated.

Committees are being organized to call on alumni throughout the 12-county Diocese. Alumni of the two colleges living outside the Diocese also are being solicited for contributions through chapter meetings in various areas.

Married couples who both are graduates of the colleges may designate the amount of the pledge to be allocated to each school.

Bishop Kearney Presides At Parish Patronal Feast

Horseheads—"For the glory of the Virgin Mary and for our own consolation, we proclaim Mary Mother of the Church, of the whole People of God, of the faithful as well as the pastors. And we wish that through this title the Mother of God should be still more honored and invoked by the Christian people."

Basing his remarks on these words of Pope Paul, Bishop James E. Kearney addressed the parishioners and priests and Sisters of the parish of Saint Mary Our Mother, Horseheads, on the occasion of their parish "east day, the feast of the Maternity of Our Lady, Monday Oct. 11.

"The most beautiful word in the dictionary is the word mother. Just as the Holy Father has given the title, Mother of the Church, to the world, so your priests have given the title, Mary Our Mother, to the parish."

"I am very happy," said the Bishop, "to be with you and to offer the Holy Mass on the Feast of the Motherhood of Mary."

Before the Mass, Bishop Kearney was serenaded by the boy and girl Scouts, the school children, the Altar boys, school band and two little children, Michael Hulbert and Barbara Genlas, who presented him with a bouquet of white roses as a token of the motherhood of Mary.

Following the Mass at 5:15 o'clock, Bishop Kearney blessed the new Administration-Rectory Center, praying that in it there may be "strength, humility, goodness of heart, and gentleness." The ARC will be open for visitors on Tuesday through Friday from 7 to 9 o'clock. All are welcome.
