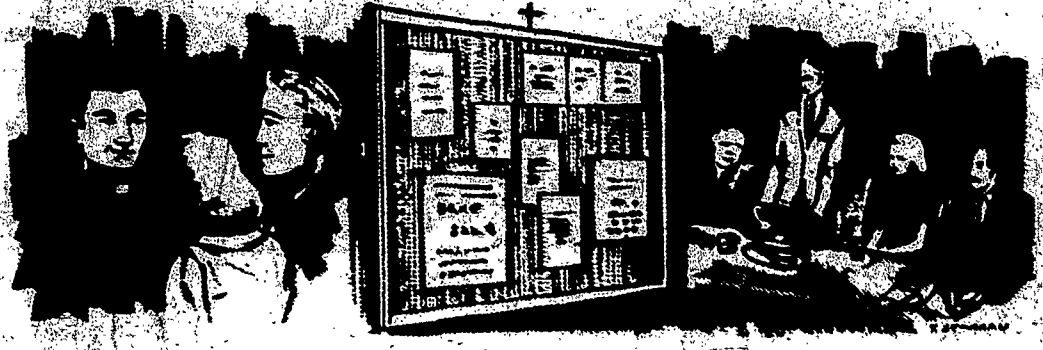

## 'Renewal' Theme For Protestants

New York—(RNS)—Protestants were urged by the National Council of Churches to dedicate Reformation Sunday, Oct. 31, to the pursuit of Christian unity and to the up-dating of contemporary churches to play a meaningful role in today's world.

"Protestants will dedicate the day this year to a new search for unity in renewal," said Dr. Ralph M. Holdeman, associate director of the NCC Commission on Evangelism in a Reformation Day message.

"Does the church need to take a fresh look at itself, and then prepare for some drastic detouring to meet the needs of people in our rapidly changing space-age world? Can the church experience a renewed Reformation? We believe it can and should," Dr. Holdeman said.

"We are happy that the Catholic Church is busy, too, with 'renewal,' with 'reform.' We see that unity in Christ's gift to His church. If we are to be true in this new reformation, we are called upon to pray and work for unity for the sake of our witness in the world."

## Texts Stress Jewish Heritage

Miami—(NC)—Textbooks emphasizing the Jewish background of Christ and the Church are being tried on an experimental basis here in an attempt to eliminate religious prejudice.

The diocese of Miami is experimenting with the first three volumes of a projected 12-volume series of religion texts for elementary and junior high schools. The books are being used at St. Michael's elementary school.

"We haven't used them long enough to be able to evaluate them yet," said Msgr. William F. McKeever, diocesan superintendent of schools. But he said the books may be adopted for the rest of the diocese if they prove useful in the test.
