

### New Parish Unit Planned in Apalachin

Ground breaking ceremony for Apalachin's new St. Margaret Mary's Church, offices and rectory took place last Sunday, Oct. 17. Main speaker at the event was Monsignor Donald Cleary, Dean of Tompkins & Tioga Counties. The church, offices and rectory, costing \$400,000, will be located on Pennsylvania Avenue. Seventeen acres of land were purchased for the church site in 1962 from Wilbur VanRiper. Architect

is James Mowry of Binghamton. Included in the Apalachin plans is a parking lot for 250 cars in front of the Church. The church, offices, and rectory will be interconnected by corridors. The hall is planned for future construction. Walls will be faced with California red wood. Cedar shingles will be used for the roofing. The church proper will have large butresslike projections of poured concrete set with stone.




