Vitamin Pill for Schools

Auburn — State and federal aid for which schools in the Auburn School may be eligible were discussed at the joint meeting of the Auburn Board of Education and the Cayuga County Catholic School board held last Wednesday at St. Mary's School.

The session was attended by 33 persons and presided over by Rev. Malachy Mahoney, O. Carm., principal of Mount Carmel High School.

The program opened with a narrated film, "The Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965." It was shown by Carl Andrews, administrative assistant to the Auburn superintendent of schools.

Father Malachy said the federal law was meant to be a "stimulus pill" for the community instead of a full course meal.

The Carmel principal also presented a report on the progress of the public-parochial school committee on "shared time" and "dual enrollment" between public and parochial schools.

According to the report there were three final decisions reached as a result of the first meeting of the two groups on Sept. 25 at Mt. Carmel High School.

The Squires were welcomed by Mayor Maurice I. Schwartz. Father Kellner informed the mayor and council that the boys were studying government and also "just visiting."

First it was decided that Congressman Samuel S. Stratton will be closely advised of the proceedings of any plans or proposals.

The second decision was a proposed meeting of the two school boards which was held last Wednesday.

The third proposal was that competent assistance be sought for the task of preparing any proposal for the state or federal government.

The survey listed a report from Mrs. Helen Clark, librarian at West High School. Mrs. Clark's report concerned Title II of the Elementary and Secondary Act and was the result of meeting held Sept. 22 at St. Alphonsus School between elementary principals of public and parochial schools and Mr. Andrews.

Dr. Ralph Getty, vice president of the Auburn board of education spoke on "Changing Times." "The creation of a parochial school board of education is evidence of the changing times," Dr. Getty said.

Dr. Getty urged everyone to read the "Look-See Column" of George R. Metcalf on "The State Constitution" which appeared in the Oct. 8 issue of the Auburn Citizen-Advertiser.

A report on the activities in the Rochester school district

were also discussed by the two school boards.

William Paradise, coordinator of the special assistance programs for Catholic school systems of the Rochester Diocese, was the main speaker.

Mr. Paradise said he hopes to coordinate planning and implement programs to be funded by the Elementary and Secondary Education Act between the public school districts and the 19 Catholic schools in the same area.

Rev. William M. Roche, superintendent of schools in the Rochester diocese, also spoke on the present turn of events, especially in the Auburn area.

"The meeting here is a historic one. It combines the best sources of this community focusing on the child, which is the important consideration of this group," Father Roche said.

"The most important thing to begin with in the developing education of children in this community," according to Father Roche. "This is the best framework in which to operate, he said.

The Catholic school superintendent spoke on separation of state and church and said the Catholic schools would continue to teach religion but there was no reason why the community should not be responsible for the teaching of arts and sciences to these same children.

"There is no reason why a father or child should be penalized or considered a second class citizen because he wants to combine education and religion," Father Roche remarked.

"In the American Way we can develop something unique yet definite," he concluded.
