'Impeded'

Prelate Dies

Vaikan City-(RNS) - Vati-can Radio reported that Bishop Badalik of Veszprem, --- 11 at the Humgary, died on Oct. 11 at the age of 74.

The bishop has been listed in the Annuario Pontífico, the Vatican yearbook, as "impeded," or unable to administer his office because of Communist oppression.

In May, Bishop Badalik was reported as living in Hejce, northeast Hungary, still not per-mitted to enter his diocese or to exercise his episcopal func-tions. The report said, however, that he could travel in Hungary; except in his own diocese.

Bishop Badalik was a nationally-mown Dominican preacher named Bishop of Veszprem by COUNCILMAN AT-LARGE Pope Pius XII in 1949. The dio cese was once occupied by X Josef Cardinal Mindszenty, Pri-X mate of Hungary, who has been in asylum at the American legation in Budapest since 1956.
