

### Pickets Protest Negro Prelate

New Orleans — (RNS) — Auxiliary Bishop-elect Harold R. Perry of New Orleans, first American-born Negro Catholic bishop in the South, passes a picket protesting his appointment to the Louisiana See. Woman holding sign is Mrs. J. B. Gaillot, who was excommunicated in 1962 for defiant opposition to the Catholic stand on desegration. She was among a group of segregationists who picketed the procession attending the installation of Most Rev. Philip M. Hannan as 11th Archbishop of New Orleans. Although New Orleans segregationists expressed outrage at the appointment of Bishop Perry, he was lauded by many Non-Catholic clergymen and Negro leaders in the city.

Throughout the remainder of the Council, seminarians and student priests from Rome's North American College, with Father Ramon Garcia, CCD representative from the U.S. in Latin America, will be on hand to explain special features of the exhibit and of the renewal underway in catechetical methods. CCD literature is available in Spanish, Portu-guese, and English.




