

Prelate Warns On 'Errors'

Little Rock — (NC) — Bishop Albert L. Fletcher of Little Rock sent a letter to the Catholics of his Arkansas See, correcting "inaccurate statements" by secular newspapers concerning the Second Vatican Council's Declaration on Religious Freedom. The letter was published in the Guardian, Little Rock diocesan weekly.

"A man has no right to pick out what he wants to believe," Bishop Fletcher wrote. "He must believe what is true. If he sincerely believes what he thinks is true, this does not necessarily make him right, but he is obliged to follow his certain conscience, even if his conscience is in error."

Priest Raps Times Report On Population

Providence — (NC) — A priest member of a conference of population problems has sharply criticized coverage of the conference by the New York Times.

Father William P. Haas, O.P., president of Providence College here, said the Times story was a "highly prejudicial misinterpretation" of the work of the Notre Dame Conference on Population Problems.

The Times' story said the conference gave "qualified endorsement to contraception and suggested a change in the Church's traditional stand on birth control."

The article also said the majority "agreed that there is dependable evidence that contraception is not intrinsically immoral. Therefore there are certain circumstances in which it may be permitted or even recommended."

The article added that the conference members were not convinced by arguments from natural law, and saw no difference between birth control pills and other methods of contraception.

Father Haas said the discussions of the group were confidential so as to insure "complete freedom to speculate about all possible approaches," and that it was therefore "very disturbing" that the Times carried a story on them.

Layty Kept Out As Principals

Washington — (NC) — A publication of the National Catholic Educational Association has called it "a real shocker" that 95.3 per cent of the nation's Catholic high schools will not permit a layman to be principal.

Commenting on a recently published statistical study made by the NCEA, an editorial in "Pointers for Principals" called it a "very unfair policy" by the schools.

"Surely the Sisters who are able to see the need and the justice in joining a picket line must also see the injustice of a school system which bars a lay person as top administrator when he is obviously the best prepared," said the editorial.

Apathy on Integration

Jamaica, N.Y. — (NC) — A Catholic law school dean charged here that northern Catholics have to a great extent opted out of the struggle to obtain integrated education for Negroes.

Father Robert F. Drinan, S.J., dean of the Boston College law school, called the "absence and apathy" of northern Catholics on the issue of school integration "sociologically understandable but theologically scandalous."

"It betrays an immoral indifference towards one of the greatest injustices of this generation," the priest said in a sermon at a Red Mass in Immaculate Conception church here sponsored by the Queen's Guild of Catholic Lawyers.

Father Drinan deplored the "tragic plight of predominantly Negro schools in the North and said it is more and more obvious that the central issue in 'inter-racial justice' is the

"The indisputable fact is that the predominantly Negro school does not and cannot provide equality of educational opportunity," he stated.

The Jesuit law dean said the "vast majority" of northern, urban Catholics have "removed themselves by geography, by status and by their devotion to Catholic schools from any concern with the schools attended largely by Negroes."

He said it is "probably tragically true" that Catholics generally become involved in this issue only when the possibility arises that Negro children may be transferred to all-white schools in suburbs where they live.

"This possibility has prompted Catholics to join and even to form organizations which purport to express parental desires for neighborhood schools but which in effect, if not by intention, are established to confine the Negro to his present ghetto by preventing the entrance of his children into white suburbia," he charged.

'Well-Off' Catholics Shun Duties to Poor

Washington — (NC) — Poverty is widespread today because "too many Catholics have carelessly overlooked their obligations to fight for social justice and charity," a priest-socialist told the St. Vincent de Paul Society here.

Father J. J. Tierney, S.J., director of the Institute of Human Relations at Loyola University, New Orleans, appealed in particular to "those Catholics who attend Mass and receive the sacraments, have good incomes, and live comfortably in split level or other nice homes in the suburbs, but over-

look their moral obligations to help the poor."

"Unfortunately," he added, "these Catholics have lost the tradition of charity which is one of the great glories of the Catholic Church."

"They must realize that their religion should mean more to them than attending Mass and going to the sacraments — as important as these duties are. They have the obligation in conscience to help their needy neighbors, regardless of race or creed, because Christ said: 'Inasmuch as you do unto the least of my brethren, you do unto me,'" he said.
