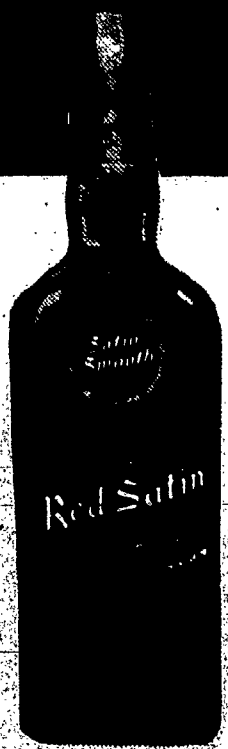


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Bishop Marrocco Slated For Serra Convention

157 parishes of the twelve-country Diocese of Rochester will participate in the seventh annual Catholic Bishops' Thanksgiving Clothing Collection for the needy abroad, to be held during the week of Nov. 14. In making this announcement, Bishop Kearney also appointed Father Robert J. Kanka, associate editor of the Courier-Journal, to head the diocesan campaign for usable clothing.

The local collection will be part of a nationwide drive during the Thanksgiving season which is directed by Catholic Relief Services, the overseas relief agency of the American Catholic bishops. The national drive last year resulted in a total of over 18 million pounds of clothing for the world's poor. Since the first collection in 1949, the Rochester Diocese alone has contributed more than five million pounds of usable clothing.

Last year, 139 parishes in the Diocese donated 565,580 pounds, a record total. The clothing was subsequently distributed among the needy in 56 countries of Europe, Asia, Africa and Latin America, without regard to race, color or creed.

About 30 boys at a time make the "Boy Retreats," which are a winning combination of inspiration and recreation. The boys, who come from all over New York State, have retreat conferences, like grown-up retreatants, but also have time for sports and games. Said one boy enthusiastically to his father after he returned home from retreat:

"It was neat, Dad. Gee, it's the first time that Christ ever really meant anything to me. And still, we all had a terrific time!"

FATHER COGAN, who talks with hundreds of boys in his own way, doesn't feel that they're too young to benefit from a weekend retreat.

In fact, his own impression is that these are vital years for a retreat.

"A kid has a lot on his mind. He's thinking about what he'd like to be when he grows up. He's curious about a lot of things. He needs a "time-out" to talk things over with God in his own way. And it's a chance

to corner a priest to discuss some of the things he's got tucked in the back of his mind."

CDA Hears Fisher Prof

At the last meeting of the Catholic Daughters of America, Court of Our Lady of the Cenacle No. 1139, Joseph Polizzi, instructor in sociology at St. John Fisher College, presented a three-part, illustrated slide lecture on Italy.

The first part was devoted to research of the peasant women and their environment; the second, the changes in land form and living conditions that occurred since the government intervened and third, the Italy that attracts tourists.

Polizzi completed his research project under a Fulbright Grant and worked under the auspices of the University of Naples.
