Mrs. Ehmann, 87, widow of Benedict Ehmann of 487 Hinchey Road died Oct. 20, 1965. She was a life long member of St. Boniface Church and active in several Catholic women's organizations.

Father Ehmann, pastor of St. Michael's Church, Rochester celebrated the Solemn Requiem Mass assisted by the Rev. James Lawlor, deacon, and the Rev. Francis J. Taylor, sub-deacon.
