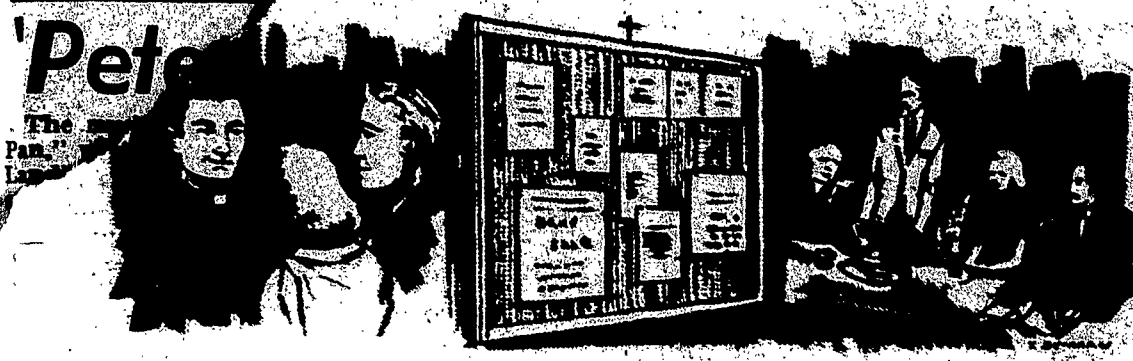

Golden Jubilee Year of St. Stanislaus Church, Rochester was to be climaxed with Pontifical Mass celebrated by Bishop Kearney to mark the 50th anniversary of the first church's dedication, Father Joseph A. Balcerak, pastor, announced.

In response to a call from Supreme Knight Francis P. Matthews, Knights of Columbus Councils in the diocese were urged by Bishop Kearney to join in prayer for peace on Armistice Day and Rochester Council members were called on by Grand Knight Joseph P. Flynn to attend the garri men's Mass at St. Mary's Church on that day.

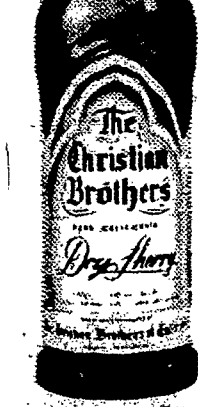
