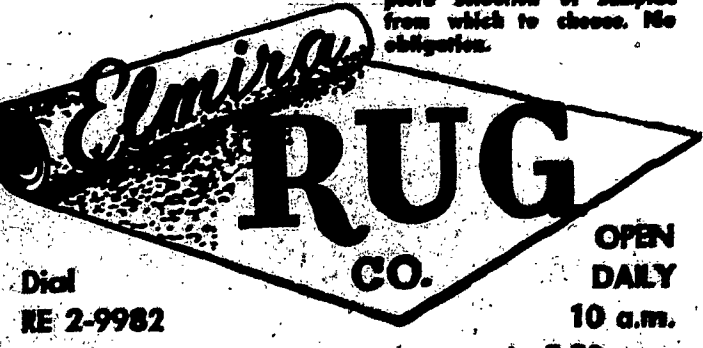
Nuns Ahead Of Priests In Renewal

Maximilian Albrecht Noted Conductor Makes Home at Monastery

A distinguished German composer and conductor, whose career was twice derailed under the Nazi government because of his political opinions, is spending the autumn years of his long career at a Benedictine monastery near Elmira.

Maximilian Albrecht, it should be noted, has not become a monk! He is happily married, but he and his wife reside at Mount Saviour monastery, where she has charge of the guest house. For a time, he served as director of vocal music at the monastery, but now devotes full time to composition.

Professor Albrecht twice lost important musical positions, because of "policy differences" with the Nazi administration in the 1930's. In 1933, he was dismissed from his post as director of the Radio Berlin chorus. On this occasion, he sued the government for breach of contract, and actually won his case.

In 1937, he was Municipal Conductor in the Prussian city of Stettin. When it was announced that he would conduct the "Passion of St. Matthew," in a church during Holy Week, he was warned that such religious emphasis might cost him his job. He went ahead and conducted the classic work — and lost another job.

performed in New York City's Town Hall by the Amor Artis Chorale and the Amor Artis Orchestra.

The performance received many laudatory reviews. One critic, in the German-American weekly, "Aufbau," said that with this work, Albrecht had established himself in New York's musical world, "as a composer well noted in tradition, yet a master as well of the contemporary idiom of instrumental and vocal technique."

Another Albrecht composition, a musical setting for Psalm 25, was performed in a "Music of Faith" program held at Temple Beth El in Rochester last February. It was sung by the Eastman Polyphonic Choir conducted by Dr. M. Alfred Bichsel.

A classical musician in the traditional mould, Professor Albrecht cannot restrain a sigh of regret at the passing of Latin from the Church's liturgy. But, having gone through more serious trials in his long career, he is even adjusting himself to this.

In fact, one of his latest compositions is a beautiful Mass in English. Entitled the "Union English Mass of Mount Saviour," it is dedicated to Dom Damascus Winzen, whose hospitable invitation brought the composer to stay at Mount Saviour.
