Questions will be framed to help orient members of the club toward their future jobs.

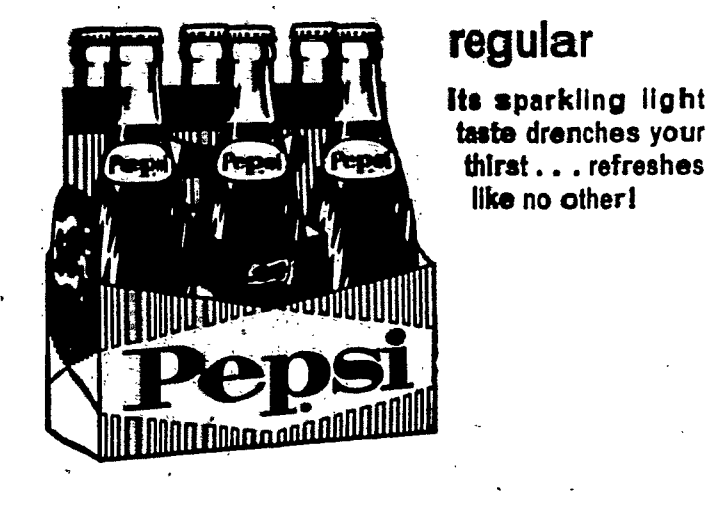

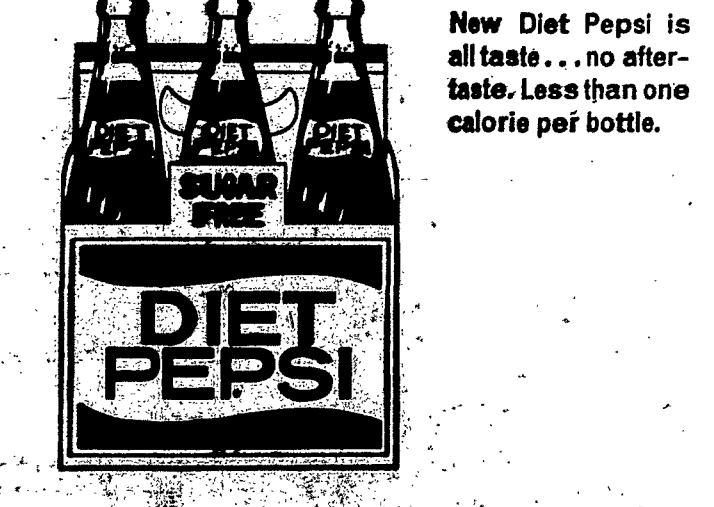


Mission Day Plug

Illustrating Book Week

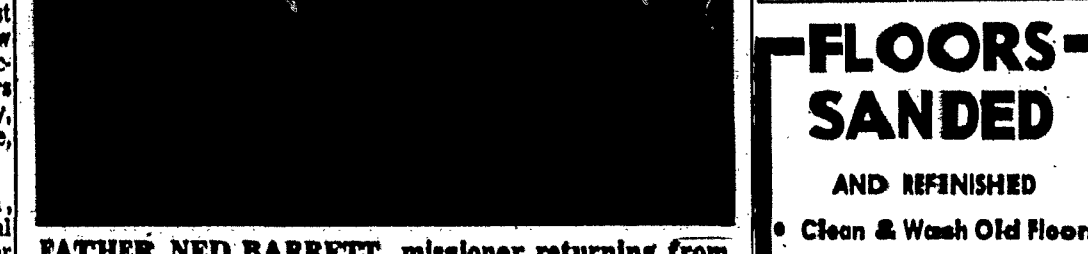
