St. Mary's Judith Allen

State's Number 1 Student Nurse

20-year old Judith Allen, senior student at St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing, probably won't have much trouble finding a job after graduation.

She was recently named New York State's "Outstanding Student Nurse of 1965," when the Student Nurses Association met in Rochester. She competed against finalists from each of the association's 13 areas to gain the honor.

The winner had to rate high in "scholastic ability and creativity, poise, appearance, extracurricular activities and knowledge of student and graduate (nursing) organizations."

Judith is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Stanley P. Allen of 43 Briggs Avenue, Fairport. She is a graduate of Blessed Sacrament School in Rochester, and of Fairport High School.

She's had a nursing career in mind since grade school days, and wants to specialize in the care of mentally retarded children. This particular interest was sparked by Christmas party she helped plan for retarded children when she was a student at Fairport High, and by her acquaintance with "a dear friend who has a mentally retarded child."

She rates superlatives from her superiors at St. Mary's Hospital. Sister Victoria, nursing Director there, says:

"She has all the qualities needed for a person who is going to serve others. She is very generous—I think her choice of a future field shows that, and she has the potential to do outstanding work in nursing."

The new honor conferred on the petite senior also brings many responsibilities. She will serve as chairman of Nurse Week, and as delegate to the association's national convention, the State Exposition at Syracuse and the National Conference on Citizenship at Washington. She will also promote interest in a nursing career at high school vocation assemblies.

First things are first for student nurse Judith Allen, however, and when she entered the finals for the "outstanding nurse" award, she specified that if she won, she'd carry out the ensuing duties, "as much as they are compatible" with her own training responsibilities.

The first St. Mary's student to win this honor, Judith will graduate from nursing school in June, 1966.

Earle Spicer Scheduled In Fisher Lecture Series

New York baritone Earle Spicer will perform at St. John Fisher College Monday, Nov. 15, 8:15 p.m. at Kearney Auditorium. There is no admission charge, and the public is invited.

Spicer's program will include traditional English and American folk songs, and ballads of very ancient origin. He will add brief comments on the various songs.

The artist, who was born in Nova Scotia, studied voice, piano, and organ while in college. Later he studied in New York and London. Spicer has sung with leading orchestras and oratorio societies in the United States and England. For three years he was featured soloist with Donald Voorhees and the NBC orchestra.

Spicer possesses a trained voice of remarkable flexibility, resonance, power and dramatic sense. A favorite of campus audiences, he has sung at more than 500 colleges and universities. His appearance at St. John Fisher is part of the college's 1965-66 Lecture Series.
