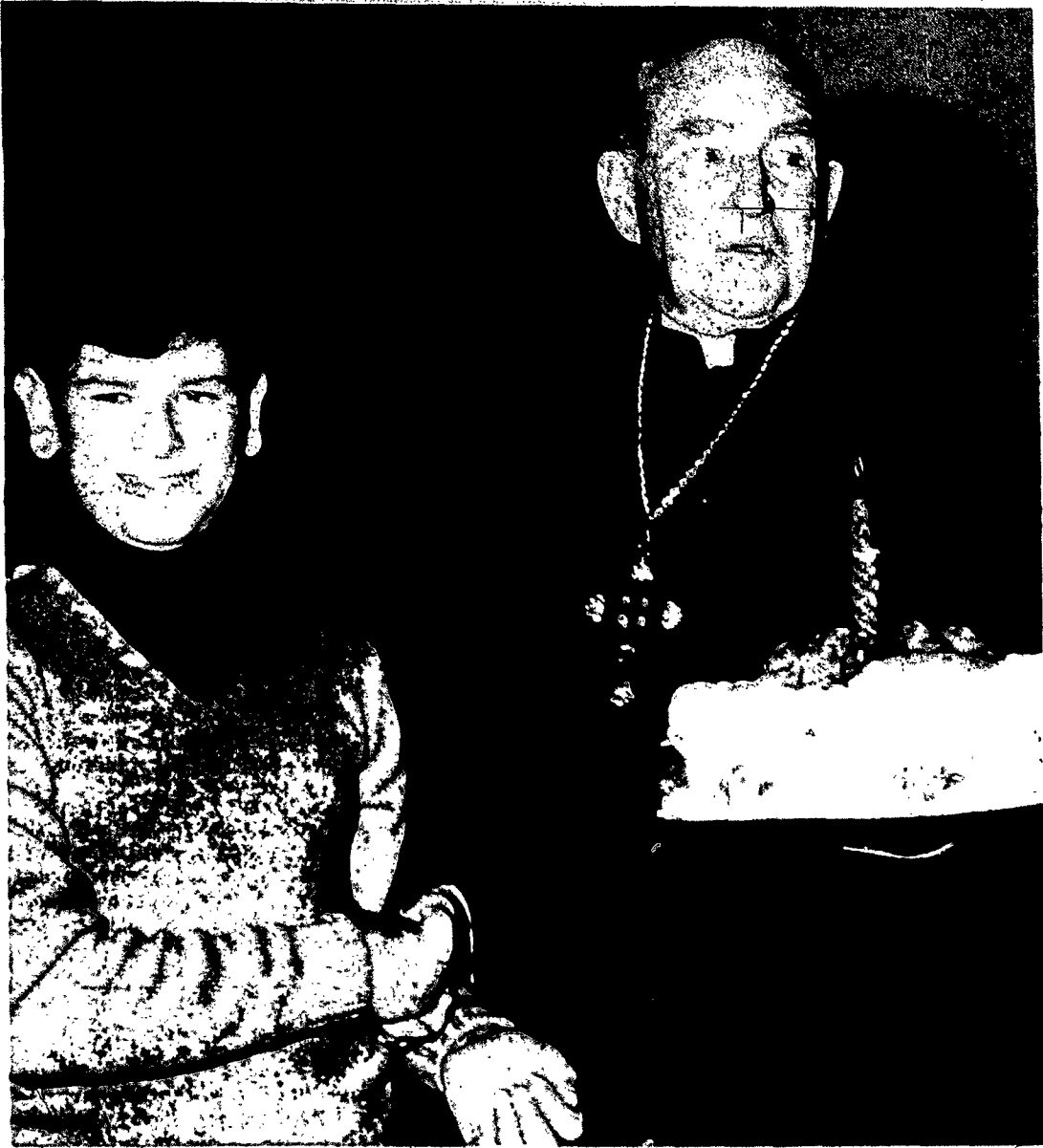


Fund Drive Rally in Auburn

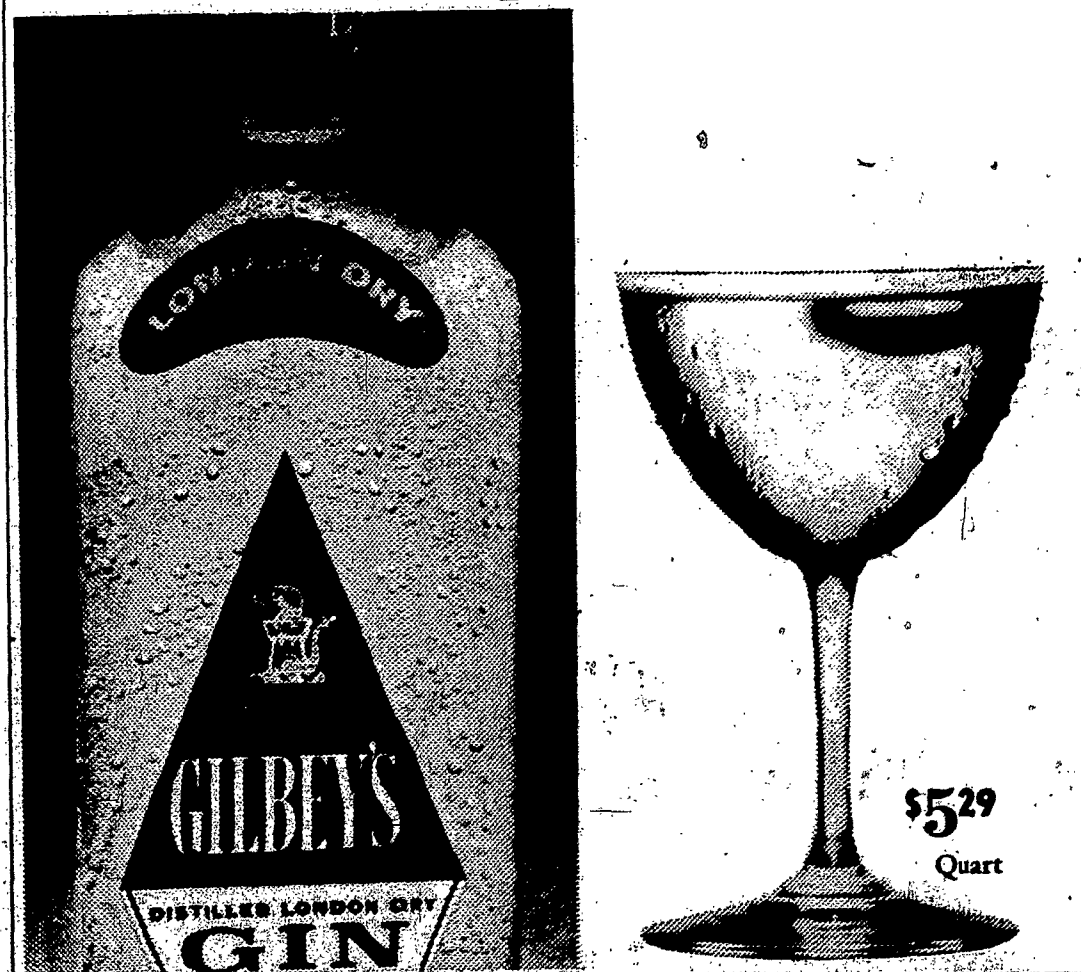
Andrew J. Tabone gave Bishop Kearney a birthday cake and fund drive workers at Auburn rally sang traditional greeting to climax fund drive launching there.

Priest-Brother Offers Louis A. Whalen Requiem

Solemn Funeral Mass for Louis A. Whalen Jr. was offered by his brother, Rev. John S. Whalen in St. Thomas the Apostle Church, Saturday, Nov. 13. Mr. Whalen was a brother of Sister Mary Louis, vice principal of Bishop Kearney High School.

Supervisor of wage administration of Eastman Kodak Co.'s Apparatus & Optical Division, Mr. Whalen, 56, died Nov. 10, 1965 in his home, 709 Oakridge Drive, Irondequoit.

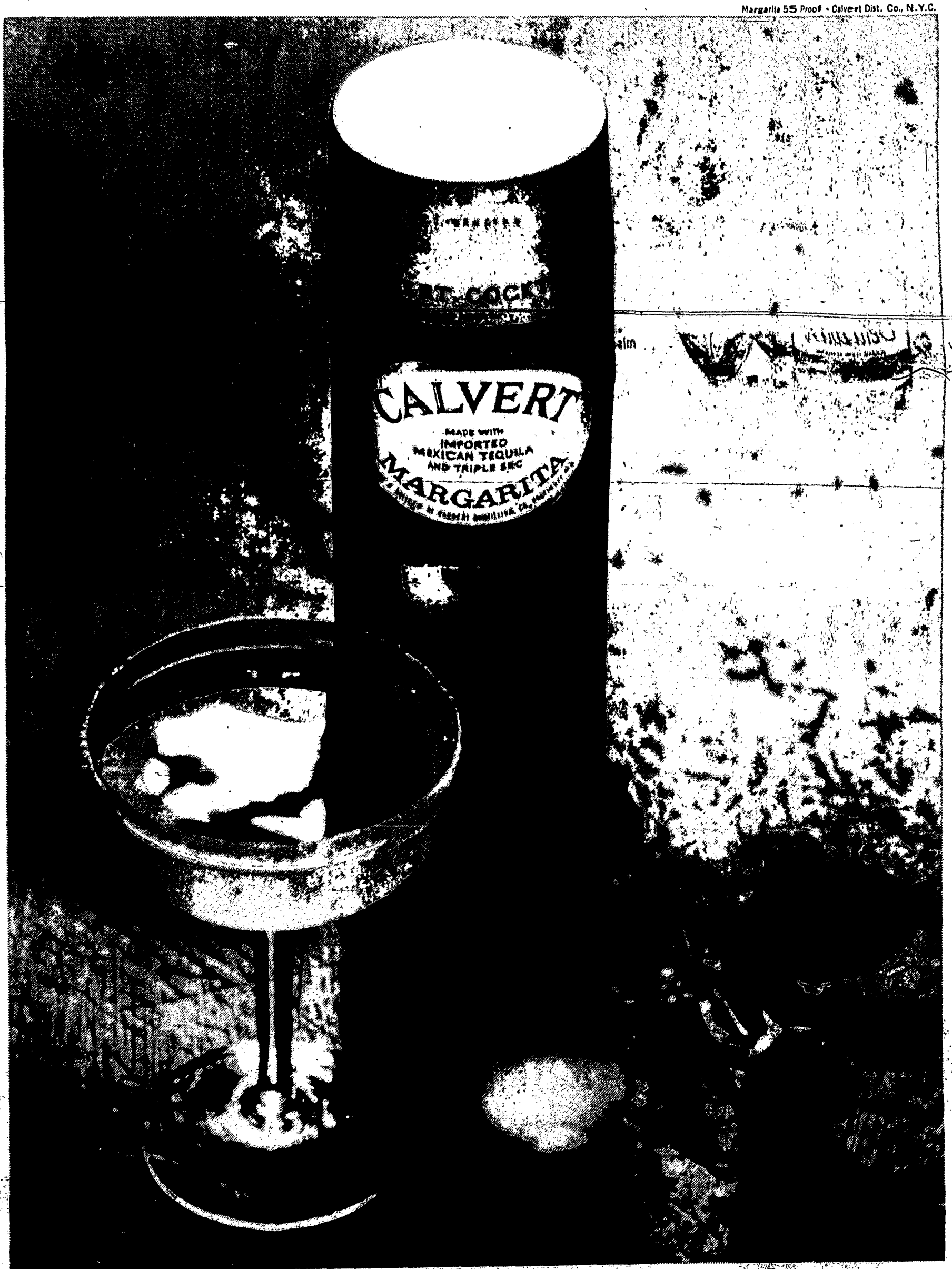
