### St. John's Architect Honored

Rochester architect James H. Johnson (right) was awarded the 1965 Lillian Fairchild Award from Prof. George H. Ford, chairman of the University of Rochester English Department and head of the award committee. The young architect was cited for his design of the Church of St. John the Evangelist in Greece. The Fairchild Award, which carries with it a check for \$185, was set up in 1924 by the late Prof. Herman Leroy Fairchild of the University of Rochester Geology Department in memory of his daughter. It is given annually to the resident of Rochester or vicinity "who has produced within the previous year the most meritorious and praiseworthy creation of art, poetry, or literature of the imagination."

### Liturgy Changes Confusing

## Preparation Lacking

St. Louis — (RNS) — The principal impediment to bringing liturgical changes into widespread acceptance in the Catholic Church has been "innovation with preparation," a nun theology professor told the International Federation of Catholic Alumnae here.

Sister Ann Patrick Ware, S.L., a member of the theology department of Webster College, said the results of liturgical reform cannot yet be known. She called the past year "a crucial year" so far as liturgical changes are concerned, but said the time has come "when each person must choose whether his final criterion for accepting change in the Church is going to be based on 'Do I
