New York — (RNS) — A priest from India, addressing the annual Jesuit Mission Benefit Dinner here, stressed that the Roman Catholic Church must greatly expand its missionary role in Asia and Africa today.

Father Jerome D'Souza, S.J., said that many countries on the two continents are becoming increasingly aware that the Church is supernatural, with a universal impact not restricted to the West.

"The world is hungry for God and this is no less true in Asia and Africa than in Europe and America," he said. Father D'Souza is assistant for India to Father Pedro Arrupe, new General of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in Rome.
