Objection: In this action film, of particular appeal to young audiences, sexual immorality on the part of the principal characters is casually presented.

Boeing Boeing
Objection: A thread of vulgar suggestiveness seriously mars this sex farce.

Return of Mr. Moto, The
Objection: Suggestive dancing.

Class C
Repulsion
Objection: Utterly relentless in its depiction of the mental breakdown of a homicidal psychotic, this film is completely lacking in any feeling of humanity for its central character. In spite of its technical brilliance, it is horror for horror's sake, and its viewing can be a dangerously dehumanizing experience for anyone who is not a professional psychologist. Moreover, brilliance in technique alone is not artistic justification for the erotic and brutal intensity of some of its treatment.

Love In 4 Dimensions
Objection: With the exception of its first segment, this film is chiefly concerned with lust, and its treatment habitually panders to prurient interest.

GOD LOVE YOU

Most Reverend **Fulton J. Sheen**

Here at the Council, many missionary bishops visit our seat begging for Mass stipends. Some tell how their priests have been without stipends for almost a year. Others tell how their priests may live on as few as 10 stipends a month. Almost all inquire as to why there has been such a decline in the faithful's realization of the value of a Mass offered for their personal intentions.

One reason that we give is that there is a "pool" of Mass stipends created by certain organizations. For example Mr. A. gives \$5 for an embossed card saying that he will be "remembered" in Mass; Mrs. B. gives \$10; Miss C. gives \$3 and receives a smaller card promising "remembrances." This sum is "pooled" and may run into thousands of dollars. Last Christmas we received such a card from a well-meaning benefactor. It promised me "remembrances" in 9,900 Masses! For this he paid \$10. Why 9,900 remembrances when there are 67,000 priests in the United States and 428,716 priests in the world? Each one of them is bound to remember every member of the Church each time he offers the Holy Sacrifice. Just read over the Canon of the Mass and see how often you are "remembered." Some cards promise a "special remembrance." Pope John XXIII said once to us "Some people ask for my 'special' blessing. I have no 'special' blessing."

There are several points that the faithful should consider before buying remembrance cards. 1) Charity to any group or organization is laudable and will receive its reward. But to solicit charity under the guise of providing a "remembrance" which is already yours by strict justice, makes one recall that the Lord drove the "trafficers of the spiritual" out of the Temple. 2) If any Christian wants to make an offering for prayerful remembrance, let him ask that a priest promise to spend a Holy Hour for his intentions in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. See how many embossed cards you get! 3) Which would you rather have? A personal audience with the Holy Father or a general audience? Do you also want to have Christ's sacrifice renewed for you personally and in justice instead of a vague, impersonal remembrance in a group of 9,900? 4) In the stock market, it used to happen that the more worthless the stock, the more it resembled a gold certificate. May the spiritual life of the faithful not degenerate into judging the Divine favor by the size of an embossed "remembrance" card. The next time you want to remember a friend, write him (or her) a note as follows: "I have just sent a sacrifice to the Missions for the poor of the world. A missionary in some foreign land will say Mass for your intentions." **GOD LOVE YOU!**
