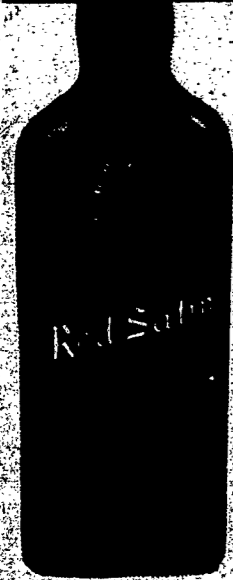

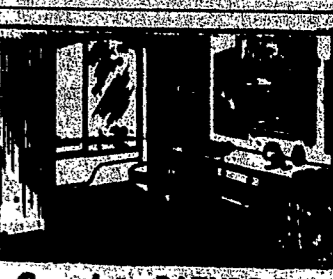

Notre Dame Grid Stars Make All-Elmira Team

Joe Cascio and Jack Leonard were honored as co-captains of Elmira's all-city team, which was named last Saturday. Both were teammates on Notre Dame's undefeated eleven this season.

Cascio, who won the city rushing and total offense crowns, was a unanimous choice to the offensive. From his half-back position, Joe went over

the goal line seven times to give him 42 points for the year, a touchdown shy of ND's Joel Ramlich's winning total.

Jack Leonard polled a vote from every voter to place him on the defensive team as a line-backer. However, Leonard's biggest asset to his team was his ability to kick the extra points.

Besides the co-captain honors, Cascio was picked as offensive player of the year, and Leonard as defensive player of the year.

Other ND stars picked for the offensive team were Bernie Minch at tackle, Nick Rossi at guard, and Ramlich at halfback. All three were unanimous choices. Joining Leonard on the defense is Bob Barnoski, one of ND's big interior linemen.

Notre Dame also placed some names on the honorable mention list. These were end Don Carmody, quarterback Mike Amisano, and halfback Pete DeSocio. All three played essen-

tial roles in ND's first undefeated season.
