

Marine Midland Income Highest
Marine Midland, Elmira reported consolidated net operating income available from common stock for 1965 of \$27,428,874 or \$2.40 per common share on 11,441,442 shares outstanding Dec. 31, 1965. This compares with 1964 income of \$28,317,717 or \$2.30 per common share on 11,449,352 common shares outstanding Dec. 31, 1964.
Cash dividends declared on common stock in 1965 totaled \$14,185,788 against \$13,378,566 in 1964. Dividends of preferred stock issued in August of 1965 were \$732,349. The provision for taxes was \$16,190,163 in 1965 and \$17,118,565 for the prior year.
Consolidated net operating income available for common stock for the fourth quarter of 1965 was \$7,481,782 or 65 cents a share after preferred dividends of \$485,000, compared with \$7,321,418 or 64 cents a share for the final quarter of 1964. The tax provision for the fourth quarter was \$4,757,920 in 1965 and \$4,510,200 in 1964.

CFM Slates Area IV Meeting in Erie, Pa.

The annual Winter meeting of the Christian Family Movement, Area IV, will take place at Gannon College, Erie, Pa., on Saturday, Jan. 15. Father Gerald Dunn, moderator of C.F.M. groups in the Rochester area, and Mr. and Mrs. Donald Perry of Fairport, will represent local C.F.M. groups at the meeting.
(Although there is not yet a formal C.F.M. federation established in this Diocese, the Perrys serve as "contact" couple to help coordinate the various groups in this vicinity.)
The morning session will be devoted to reports of activities from various federations; the afternoon will be devoted to planning for the Area IV Convention, slated for Erie next August 26-28.
Presiding at the meeting will be Ray and Hilda Hahn of the Pittsburgh Diocese. They are the Area IV president couple.

N.Y. Churches Aid Youth

New York — (RNS) — Protestant Episcopal and Roman Catholic churches here will jointly sponsor an "ecumenical benefit" Jan. 21 to help support the work of the interreligious and interracial Youth Employment Program in poverty areas of the city.
To be held in the Maritime Union Building, the entertainment will include dramatic readings, musical selections, and choir and folk singing.
Behind the program are the Trinity Episcopal parish and the Catholic chapel of Saints Faith, Hope and Charity. Under leadership of the Rev. Donald Platt of Trinity and Father John G. Donahue of the Catholic chapel, parishioners have been holding ecumenical talks and "suppers" since May.
Last year 144 churches and agencies participated in the program, employing 3,555 youths and 320 staff supervisors.
Other committee activities have included helping churches to open coffee houses, cultural and recreational centers, and to give courses in Negro heritage, civics and government.

Xerox Head Man of Year

Joseph C. Wilson, president of Xerox Corporation, was named Businessman of the Year for 1966 in the January 8 issue of Saturday Review, published this week. The selection of the 66-year-old head of the phenomenally successful Rochester corporation was announced in 58th Annual Business Issue in cooperation with the Committee for Economic Development.
Mr. Wilson, according to the citation, ". . . personifies Saturday Review's conviction that in our complex socio-economic system the modern executive must embody a personal commitment to the good society as well as to a sound economy in order to make that system work."
