

Area Germans To Mark 150 Years in Rochester

Americans of German extraction will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the arrival in Rochester of the first German-born immigrant, Jacob Hau. Event will be marked by a banquet and ball at Manger Hotel Sunday, Jan. 30 and hosted by the Federation of German-American Societies headed by John Boerschlein.

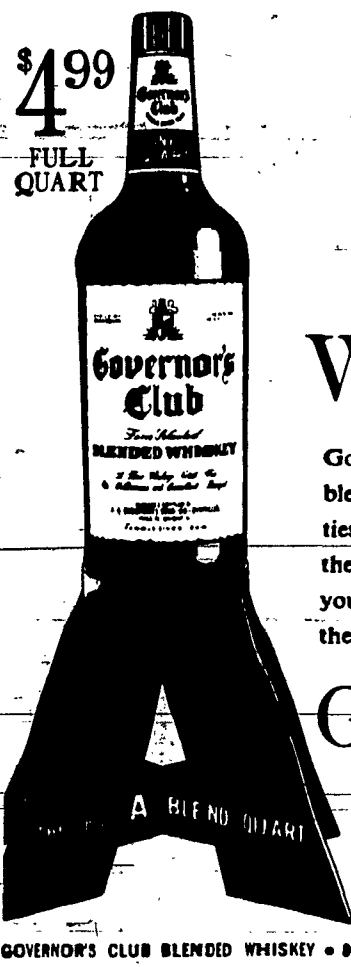
Harold Tausch's Continental Orchestra will furnish dinner and dance music. Tausch is general chairman of the celebration.

Thousands upon thousands of Germans, 150 years ago were reported as following Jacob Hau to Rochester where many of the great industries were founded by these early settlers and by others who came later.

This is pointed out by Doctor McKelvey in his review as follows: "The Germans of Rochester—their traditions and contributions—the extent of their contributions was so great and the varied facts of their experience so revealing that a historical review of the part they played in the city's development will add much to our understanding of its present as well as the past."

Doctor McKelvey will review in his address the part this large group of German-Americans played in the industrial, financial and cultural growth of Rochester.

Biographical Details of New Monsignors

Following are biographical details of the ten priests named by Pope Paul this week to be Monsignors.

MONSIGNOR COCUZZI, son of Mrs. Lazarus Cocuzzi and the late Mr. Cocuzzi of Rochester, has devoted twelve of his seventeen years in the priesthood in administrative duties at the Chancery.

He was named Notary of the Diocese in 1954, Vice Chancellor in 1955 and Chancellor in 1964. Pope John XXIII made him a papal chamberlain in 1959.

Prior to these appointments he studied three years at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome to attain his doctorate in canon law.

He was ordained in 1949 and served as assistant pastor at St. Jerome's Church, East Rochester.

MONSIGNOR DUFFY, son of Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Duffy of

Rochester, was ordained Dec. 22, 1945. He was first assigned as curate at St. James Church, Waverly, and then to St. Mary's Church, Canandaigua, in 1948. He was transferred to St. Cecilia's Church, Rochester, in

1953, to St. Stephen's Church, Geneva, in 1955 and to Holy Cross Church, Rochester, in 1960. He was named in 1961 director of the diocesan office of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, papal agency for collection of contributions to the missions.

MONSIGNOR HOGAN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Hogan of Lima, was ordained in 1942. He was assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church, Elmira, from 1942 to 1945 when he was named to the faculty at St. Andrew's Seminary. He made his post-graduate studies in Rome to attain his doctorate in theology from 1949 to 1953 and then returned to St. Andrew's Seminary. He became principal of DeSales High School in 1953 and was then made a member of the faculty at St. Bernard's Seminary in 1955 where he taught dogmatic theology for ten years. He was named rector of the new Beckel

Hall last year, a residence for seminarians attending St. John Fisher College.

MONSIGNOR KRIEG, son of Mr. and Mrs. Cyril Krieg of Rochester, was ordained in 1953. He was appointed assistant pastor at St. Joseph's Church, Wayland, and transferred in 1957 to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Rochester. He studied at the Catholic University of America at Washington to attain his degree in canon law from 1958 to 1960. He was then assigned as curate at St. Plus X Church, Chili, defensor vinculi and promotor iustitiae, Chancery positions, in 1960. The following year he was named secretary of the Diocesan Tribunal, a court for settling cases involving church laws.

MONSIGNOR MCGHAN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles McGhan of Romulus, was ordained in 1937. After one year as curate at St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira, he became chaplain at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, where he has served for 27 years.

MONSIGNOR MULCAHY, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Mulcahy of Rochester, was ordained in 1946. He served three years as curate at Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester, and then began his career in the Catholic Charities program of the Rochester Diocese. He was named assistant director of the Charities organization in 1949, director of the Catholic Family Center in 1953 and director of Catholic Charities in 1963. He attended the Catholic University of America in Washington and was one of the first priests in the nation to attain his masters degree in social work.

MONSIGNOR QUINN son of Mr. and Mrs. Theobald Quinn of Rochester, was ordained in 1940. He served as curate in parishes of the Paterson diocese for three years and then at Holy Cross Church, Rochester. He was named to the faculty at St. Andrew's Seminary in 1945 and Seminary rector in 1956. Pope John XXIII named him a papal chamberlain in 1959.

MONSIGNOR ROCHE, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Roche of Corning, was ordained in 1955. He served for one year as curate at Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester, and began his career in the diocesan schools office in 1956, being named assistant superintendent. He became superintendent of the diocesan schools in 1959. He attended Columbia University and the University of Virginia and served as a pilot in the United States Navy prior to his seminary studies.

MONSIGNOR SCHNACKY, son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Schnackny of Rochester, was ordained in 1943. He was an assistant pastor at St. Andrew's Church, Rochester, from 1943 to 1946 when he was transferred to St. Mary's Church, Auburn. He was named director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and chaplain at Nazareth Motherhouse of the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1947. He was named to be also the pastor of St. Catherine's Church, Mendon, in 1958.

MONSIGNOR SHANNON, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Shannon of Rochester, has spent 22 of his 24 years in the priesthood at Nazareth College. Following his ordination in 1943 he served one year as curate at Sacred Heart Cathedral and was named chaplain and a member of the faculty at Nazareth College in 1944. He attained his doctorate in philosophy following studies at the University of Ottawa.
