

# Notre Dame Chalks Up Two, Now 10-1

The Notre Dame Crusaders came up with their 9th and 10th victories last week. Early in the week, they fashioned a strong second half to carry them to a 66-51 victory over Elkland. Friday was a different story, as the Elmirans barely nipped Binghamton Catholic 47-46.

In the Elkland game, N.D. rode Bill Huddle's 21 points and Dan McCarthy's 16 to knock off Elkland. Big Bob Barnoski kept N.D. in the lead throughout the first half by converting several rebounds into baskets.

N.D. led the entire game. It was very close until the last 90 seconds of the third quarter when the Crusaders scored three quick baskets, giving them a safe 50-37 lead going into the last quarter.

The Binghamton game was a different story. With 55 seconds left to play, freshman Tom Russell pushed in a left handed set shot from the corner. On the play, Barnoski was fouled, went to the foul line with a 1 and 1 chance, and coolly put in

two points. This gave N.D. a 47-41 lead.

Binghamton Catholic was far from dead, however. Bob Callahan dribbled into the corner, flopped in a jump shot. On that play, moreover, Earle Rogers was fouled and sunk two free throws. Notre Dame's lead was pared to 47-45.

On a rebound attempt, Binghamton's Tom Decker was fouled. He made one of two attempts and N.D. now had a 48-46 lead.

In the waning seconds, Notre Dame's Russell missed two free throws. With three seconds left, B.C. got the ball, but had no time to score and N.D. won 47-46.

The Crusaders are now 10-1 for the season. The team is looking forward to its Feb. 1 meeting with unbeaten city rival, Academy.

The Notre Dame J.V. team remained undefeated with two more wins last week. Arnie Westervelt scored 30 points against the Binghamton Catholic Jayvees.

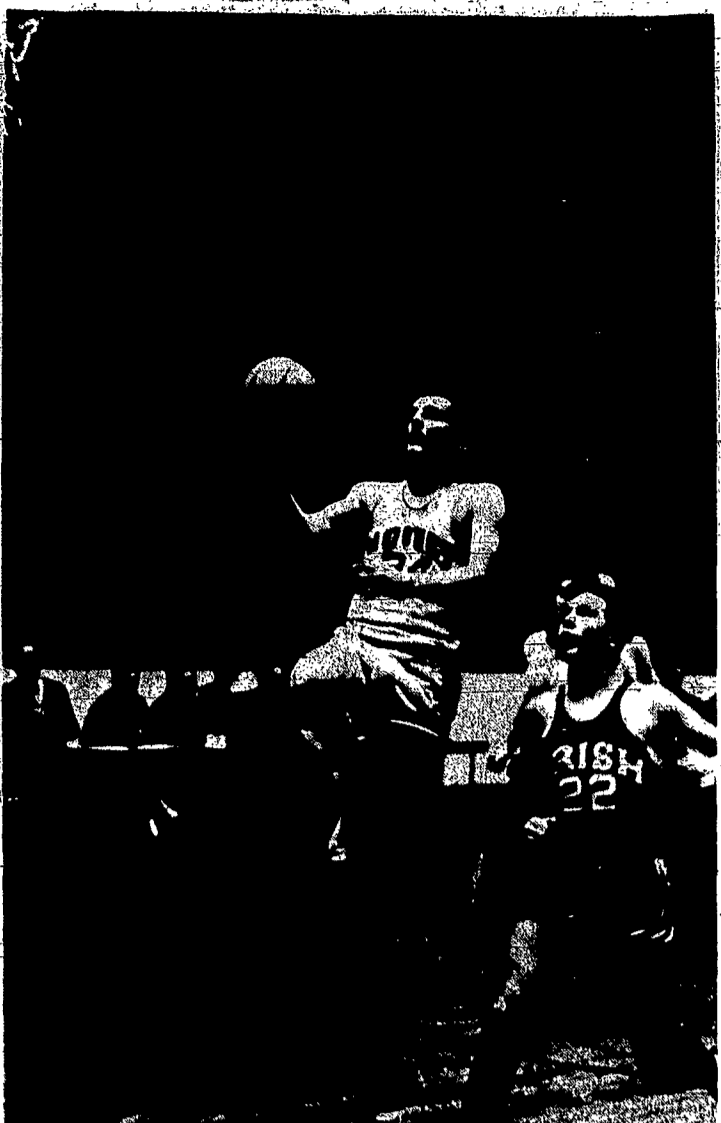

## Mooney 5 Clips Aquinas, 42-34

Cardinal Mooney and Bishop Kearney High Schools, the two new Catholic schools, really arrived on the scene last Saturday as they upset the perennial powers, Aquinas Institute and McQuaid Jesuit High Schools, at Rochester's War Memorial.

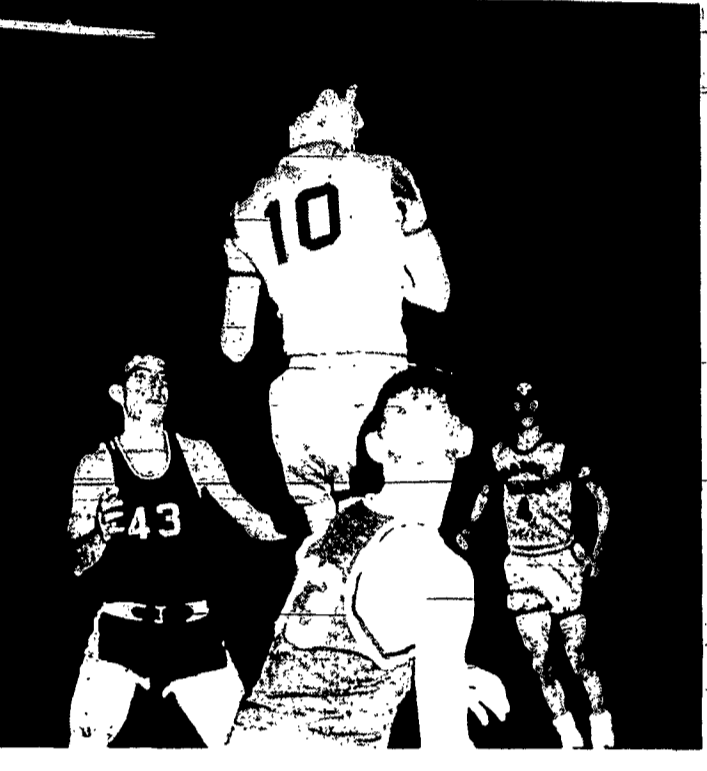
In the first game of the double header, Mooney took a strong Aquinas five, 42-34, in a thrill packed game that had the spectators on their feet much of the time. Aquinas, tall and talented, displayed good ball handling in dealing with the touted Mooney full court press. However, Mooney led 12-11 at the end of the first

quarter. The superior Aquinas rebounding strength began to tell as the Irish posted a 20-15 edge at the half. In the second half, Mooney put on a come-from-behind surge. The Cardinals defense tightened up and didn't allow a field goal to the Irish in the 3rd period while scoring 9 points themselves to go ahead 24-22.

The Cardinals kept up their hustling play in the 4th period as Captain Terry Murphy and Jim Harrington began to open the floor. The Irish countered with a man to man and zone press in the final effort but the Cardinals

only increased their lead as they capitalized on Irish errors. Terry Murphy led the Cardinal offense with 17 points while Jim Harrington had 11. Murphy, Harrington, Key Dugan, Otis Davis and Jim Musclow gave standout defensive performances. Musclow gave Mooney a strong game off the boards. For Aquinas, Jim Coffey threw in 9 points. Mooney has now won 10 and lost 3 while the Irish of Aquinas sport an 8 win and 5 lost record.

Mooney's next start is tomorrow night against Marshall on the Mooney hardwood.

## They Swim in the Gym

Ever hear of a swim team practicing in a gymnasium? Drop in at Aquinas Institute for a first hand view. No, it's not a revolutionary way of getting in condition — it's a matter of expediency. Aquinas just doesn't have a swimming pool.

Back 40 years ago, when Aquinas was being built, a pool was proposed in the plans. Due to a lack of funds, work was halted in favor of "more pressing needs." In the ensuing years the excavation was covered over to make way for a band room.

With practice limited to one hour a week at the Columbus Youth Organization pool, the Irish swimmers keep sharp by dry runs in the school gym. Not much fun, but it pays off.

Last Monday Aquinas splashed to a 51-44 win over Greece Olympia in the losers' pool for its 7th victory of the season. Two days before that the Irish dunked Bishop Kearney High 60-34. But then Bishop Kearney doesn't have a pool either. Last season the Aquinas swimmers compiled an enviable 14 won, 6 lost record.

Much of the credit goes to Father Robert Chauvin, the coach. In spite of the lack of a pool and limited practice time at the C.Y.O., Father Chauvin feels it's worth it. He

believes in sports. A college graduate before he entered the seminary, he was a well-known athlete.

"We cannot emphasize sports too much. There are so many lessons to be learned from sports. Cooperation, for instance; players must cooperate with one another and with their coaches if they are to be successful," he explains.

"There is sacrifice, too. Sure, an athlete is in his glory for the length of the contest. But it's not much joy when he's practicing all week, keeping good hours and watching his diet. This is sacrifice. There are these—and many other—lessons to be learned in sports," he points out.

With this kind of coach and this kind of dedication, the Aquinas swimmers will probably win a few more before the season ends.

## Kearney Clips Knights, 58-49

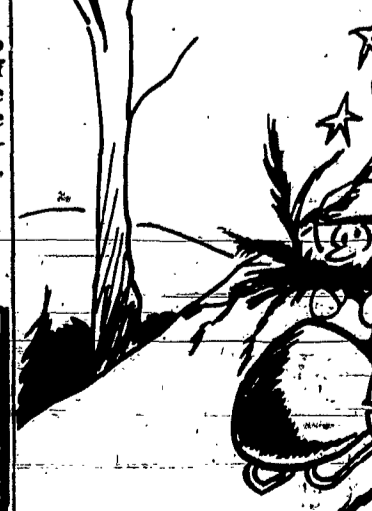
Lessons for all high school boys, grades 9-12, scheduled for Tuesday evenings from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m., began January 25.
