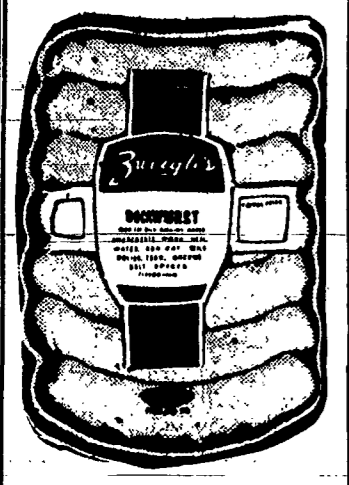

Open to the public, admission free, the program is one of a series sponsored by the Rochester Adult Societies.

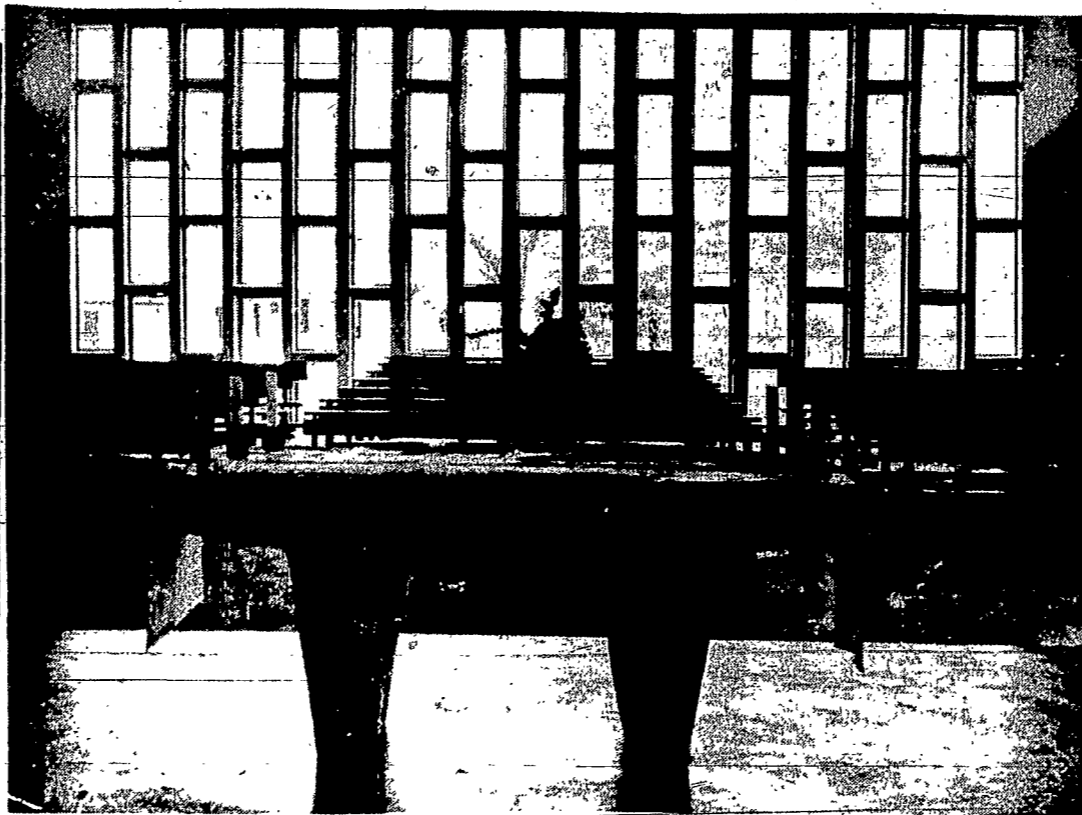
Mardi Gras

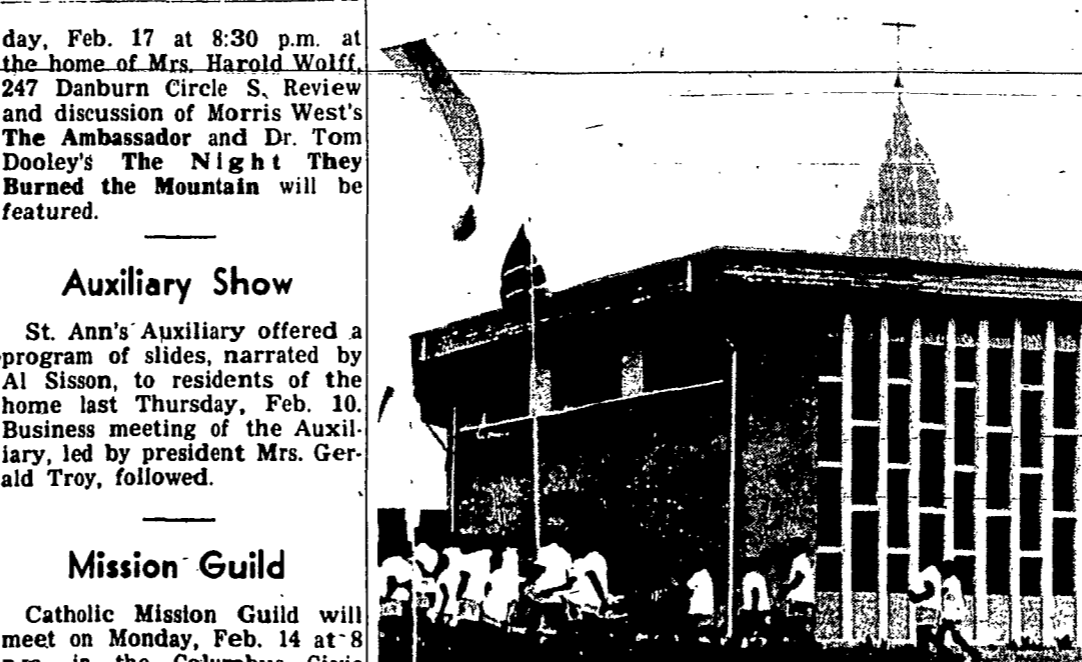

Elmira Priest Dream Fulfilled For Missioner

A long hoped for dream came true recently for a Benedictine priest from Elmira, Father Damien Milliken when he saw the dedication of a new chapel at St. Benedict's Seminary, in Namupa, Tanzania. Father Damien who was in charge of the seminary's building program from 1960 to 1965, supervised the erection of the handsome chapel in the East African country.

Father Damien, who has been stationed in Africa for the past five years, described the event in a letter home:

"I wish you all could have been here for the blessing of the chapel which took place recently. Our bishop offered the first Mass there. I had been

invited to be subleacon, but since one of our African priests was here, I begged off, for it seemed more fitting that our seminarians see as many African Fathers there at the altar as possible.

"It was a moving experience to have the first Mass offered in our own seminary chapel. The architecture lends itself to the aim of praying together. The church is in the shape of an octagon and the altar is in the center. A central triangular tower lets natural light down on the altar directly below.

"From every point of the church you get the impression that you are communicating directly with the priest offering the Mass. The altar is the most striking part of the whole. Of massive white terrazzo it was poured in one piece from a mould errect right in the African soil. To remove it the brother just dug all around it and lifted it onto a truck and brought it to Namupa. Almost pure white, it is a single slab of a table tapering to a V in the center, and resting on two tapering legs."

The church can hold 300 people, seated on three sides of the altar. Behind the altar is the sedilia (three seats); the tabernacle rests in a handsome niche in the back wall.

Windows circle the church just under the roof level. The altar faces a full-length window of ribbed concrete, eventually to be filled with stained glass from Germany.

The seminary complex, begun in 1959, now consists of chapel, dormitories, "classroom" building, priests' living quarters, administration wing and dining hall. All materials are from the area. The costs were covered by donations from abroad, including numerous gifts from friends in Rochester and Elmira.

Father Damien, as of Jan. 1, is now stationed at St. Francis Xavier Church in Lindi, a seaport town about 50 miles from Namupa. His gratitude, with a graphic picture of the need of the people, is expressed in another recent letter:

"In one of my outstations we took up a collection for the propagation of the Faith on Mission Sunday. It was the equivalent of \$14 in our money. One of the old lepers came up to the altar with the money at the offertory and piled it up very neatly there. It was painful to watch him slowly trying to stack the coins without any fingers, but he was so proud of himself to have been given the honor, and on completing his task he gave me a big wink and hobbled back to his log bench."
