So stated Dr. Kenneth O'Loane in speaking to a Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus meeting recently at the Rochester club rooms. Pointing out that this article forbids direct or indirect aid to parochial schools, he praised Governor Rockefeller's statement in the Buffalo Evening News of Dec. 16 that the question of state support of private and parochial schools "probably will be the most important issue" at the 1967 Constitutional Convention.

O'Loane, of Sacred Heart Cathedral parish, is a member of the New York State Board, Citizens for Educational Freedom and of the Lay Advisory Committee of Monsignor William M. Roche, Diocesan Superintendent of Schools.

Speaking on "Some Problems of Catholic Education," Dr. O'Loane enumerated six important ones: 1. Lack of understanding about education (among some Protestants, Jews and Catholics); 2. Misunderstanding about the support of education; 3. The school shortage; 4. Class size; 5. Organizational problems; and 6. The financial problem.

The major problem is the financial one. Parents who send their children to religious public schools are in effect, making an annual contribution to the City of Rochester of over \$20,000,000; to Greece, Irondequoit and Brighton of over \$5,000,000; and over \$700,000,000 to all of New York State.

The effect of the 2 1/2% N.Y. State sales tax was illustrated by reference to Sacred Heart Cathedral parish. Dr. O'Loane estimated it will take \$50,000 to \$75,000 more out of the pockets of parishioners this year. This, coupled with rapidly increasing state aid to secular public schools, is making the financial situation very difficult.

The remedy, he suggested, is political action through Citizens for Educational Freedom. This is the organization which aided passage of the Textbook Loan Bill that goes into effect this September. The group is currently supporting the Speno-Hardwick Health and Welfare Services bill.

At the national level, Dr. O'Loane warned against the proposal currently sponsored by Rep. Barber B. Conable Jr. "While the idea of a U.S. income tax rebate to the States for educational purposes is basically a good one," he said, "in the form in which Congressman Conable is proposing it, it will gravely short-change children in religious public schools."

In handling the other five problems O'Loane said: "Informed opinions on education must come through study and discussion of the issues." He strongly urged formation of effective Home School Associations in every parish and eventually of Parish School Boards.

"The problem of changing the opinions of those Catholics, Protestants and Jews who do not understand the school question is largely a matter of public relations. We have an excellent case, and need only to make it known," he urged. He cited a Democrat and Chronicle report published on Jan. 16 which showed 48% of the people in Monroe County and five other counties "in favor of state and federal aid to parochial schools."

"Raising this percentage a few more points will enable us to secure repeal of the Blaine amendment. However, we should be working hard on this now," Dr. O'Loane told the Knights in his conclusion.
