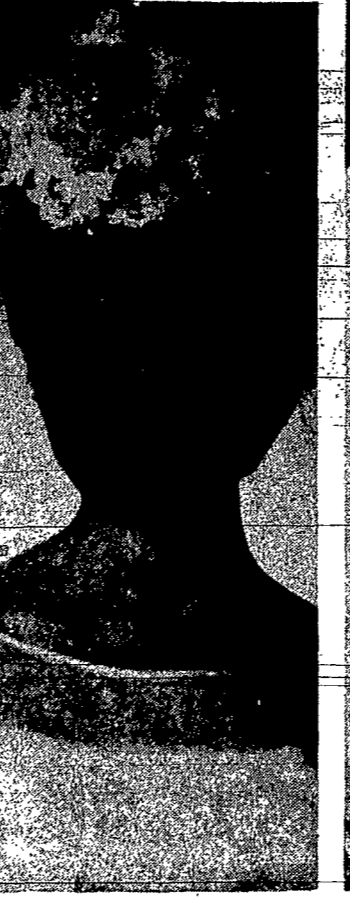

Donald Voellinger was his brother's best man. Ushers were Paul Miller, Leonard Raniewicz and George Wegman.

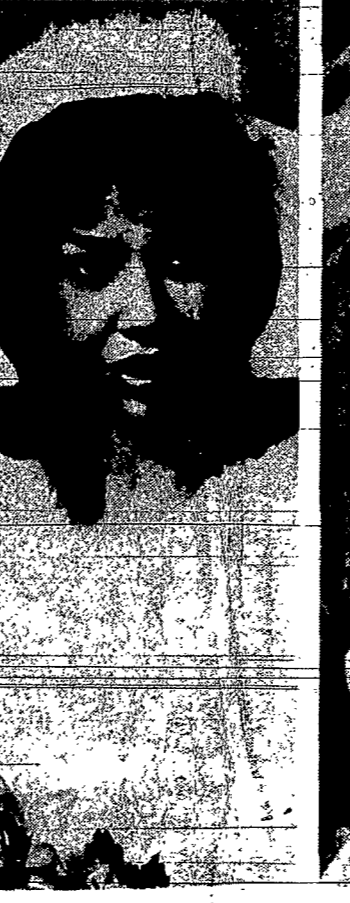

Birth Clinics in Hospitals

South Orange — (NC) — A family life clinic which will instruct Catholic married couples in the rhythm method of family limitation will open Feb. 1 at St. Michael's Hospital in Newark under auspices of the Newark archdiocese. The disclosure came from Newark's Archbishop Thomas A. Boland here at a press conference in Seton Hall University. The conference, sponsored by the New Jersey Catholic Institute of the Press and attended by 160 priests and lay persons, dealt with problems which have arisen from the Second Vatican Council.

The archdiocese detailed plans for the clinic in response to a question concerning the Vatican Council's discussions on the right of parents to limit family size. The clinic, it was explained, will be a pilot project, looking toward establishment of similar clinics in each of the nine dioceses of the archdiocese. Teams of priests, doctors and nurses will work together at the clinic. Efforts will be made to reach the fast-growing Spanish-speaking residents of the area through priests trained to work with them.

Marriage 'Permanence' Threatened

Vatican City — (RNS) — Members of the Sacred Roman Rota, the Catholic Church's court of final appeal, were received in audience by Pope Paul VI who called attention to "the marked increase in the number of cases for annulment of marriage" brought before it.

"This is a sign," he said, "that the law is no longer held as sacred. This law is the foundation of Christian marriage. It is threatened by the disquiet of modern life and by conditions which menace the health, vitality and the happiness of the family as an institution."

First set up in the 13th Century and reestablished by Pope Sixtus V in 1588, the Rota is best known as court of appeals from diocesan tribunals in matrimonial cases. Its judges form a college of prelates with a dean at their head. Since 1929, the Rota has also been the court of appeal from the civil and criminal tribunals of Vatican City.

The Pope said the Second Vatican Council had placed a great stress on the spirituality of marriage, the necessity of adequate preparation for the sacrament and the permanence of the conjugal bond.
