Boston Prelate Stresses U.S. 'Right to Dissent'

Boston — (RNS) — Cardinal Richard Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, in accepting the controversial "Good Government Award" of the American Legion's Crosscup-Pishon Post here, asserted that the "right to dissent" within the framework of American liberty "is among the most precious and must be preserved at whatever cost."

Cardinal Cushing said he agreed the honor in the name of "all those brave soldiers in Vietnam and their chaplains, who risk every danger even at this moment in their struggle for freedom in that far-off land."

Easter After 2nd Saturday?

London — (NC) — The Church of England is ready to initiate steps which may fix the date for Easter as the Sunday after the second Saturday in April each year. Sources here have indicated that Roman Catholic authorities are willing to accept the new reckoning of Easter, as long as it is agreed upon by all churches.

Priest Jailed For Stipends

Vienna — (NC) — A 48-year-old Catholic priest has been sentenced to a one-year jail term by a Hungarian court for accepting Mass stipends in foreign currency. According to the Budapest Communist party newspaper Nepszabadsag, Father Janos Olah received money from outside the country for more than 2,500 Masses he offered over a period of many years. He was also accused of accepting gifts of a phonograph and a tape recorder without notifying government authorities.
