Elmira — Notre Dame snared two more close basketball games last week, edging Ithaca 61-58 on Tuesday and coming from behind in the last 30 seconds to edge city rival Southside 47-46, on Friday. Notre Dame now boasts a 122 mark.

In the Ithaca game, behind Bill Huddle and Jack Leonard, the Crusaders built up at 32-14 lead by halftime. Ithaca struck back in the second half, coming to within 2 points with one minute to play. Huddle was then fouled and dropped two free throws to ice that game.

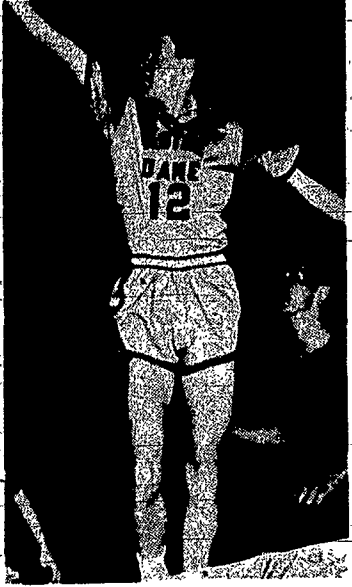
ND scored efficiently their 27-4 foul three edge as Ithaca led in foul goals by 10.

Huddle was high man with 18 points, followed by Leonard's 15, Dara McCarthy's 11, Bob McGurgan's 9, and Bob Baroski's 8.

Biggs led all scorers with 21 points. Huddle once again led ND with 16.

The ND Jayvees were dropped from the unbeaten rank by a 76-66 loss to SHS. Previously that week, the Juniors had trounced Ithaca 60-39.
