The strong possibility of a Southern Tier winner of the eighth annual Rochester Diocesan High School Basketball Tournament excites unusual interest in this year's tourney which opens next weekend. (Mar. 4-6)

Two games will take place in Rochester and two out of town. On the basis of their decisive 80-64 triumph over St. Anthony of Padua's cagers last Tuesday, the Crusaders from Elmira's Notre Dame must be rated the No. 1 Southern Tier threat in the tournament.

After having lost to Padua of Watkins Glen, earlier in a 57-55 duel, the Notre Dame club won sweet revenge in this second meeting. After a tight first quarter, ending at 22-all, the Elmira's unleashed 14 straight points in the second period, to all but clinch the game. Dan McCarthy netted 16 first half points for the winners, wound up with 22. Bill Huddle was top banana for Notre Dame with 25 points for the game. Cliff Swierski was high for the losing Paduans with 23.

Nonetheless, the Padua team, with a 13-3 record, must be considered one of the top contenders in the forthcoming tourney. Their strong team is all the more surprising in view of the total enrollment of the Watkins Glen school—112 boys.

Besides Swierski, Padua has Joe Jurewicz and Tom Malina, averaging 14 and 12 points a game each. A new starter in recent games, Dick Staklosa, is also a scoring threat.

For Notre Dame, carrying a 15-2 mark into their final scheduled game with Elmira Academy tonight (Feb. 25), Bill Huddle and Dan McCarthy provide a 1-2 punch that has been very hard to stop.

On Sunday, March 6, Aquinas meets Kearney at 2 p.m. in the R.I.T. hall, and St. Anthony of Padua-Watkins Glen, travels to Geneva, to play St. Francis de Sales at 7:30 p.m. on the De Sales court.

The winner of the Money-McQuaid contest is scheduled to play the survivor of the Padua-De Sales game the following Friday night on a neutral out-of-town court. This trip represents the first time since the tourney was inaugurated that a Rochester five has invaded the Southern Tier.

The second semi-final game pits the winner of the Aquinas-Kearney game against the winner of the Mt. Carmel-Notre Dame tilt on Sunday afternoon, March 13, at R.I.T. The same location will be the scene of the finals.

A team of six judges from Akron, Ohio will be here to judge the meet, which is sanctioned by the R.S.R.O.A.

Competition will start at 8 a.m. on Saturday and continue all day.
