Hornell Study Groups To Discuss Liturgy

Hornell—Discussion groups, to assist laymen towards a better understanding of the liturgy of the Church, will play a major role in the observance of Lent in St. Ann's parish.

Knowledge of the liturgy is essential for carrying out the recommendations of Vatican Council II, the priests of St. Ann's point out. To increase that knowledge, they will be advisers at three weekly study groups beginning on Ash Wednesday.

One group will meet each Wednesday from 8 until 9:30 p.m., another on Friday from 8 until 9:30 p.m., and a third on Sunday afternoon. The meetings will be held in the classrooms and assembly hall of St. Ann's School.

Father James Lane, pastor, Father Hugh Brady and Father Gerald Connor, assistant pastors, have extended an invitation to persons of all faiths to participate in the study discussions.

Father Aubry, SVD, Marks 60th Year in Priesthood

Father Hugo Aubry, S.V.D. of Divine Word Seminary at Conesus, celebrated the 60th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood on Thursday, Feb. 24. Saturday will be his 94th birthday. Father Aubry is one of four remaining members of the group of 46 Divine Word Missionaries ordained in 1906.

Alert and active at 94, Father Aubry is known to many of the visitors who come to the seminary here and who see him on his brisk daily walk, still a part of his schedule. To the members of the seminary he is practically a legend, with years of experience reaching back almost to the founding of the Divine Word Missionaries.

Father Aubry was born in Germany on February 26, 1872. At the age of 22 he began his

study for the priesthood in Holland, the original headquarters of the Divine Word Missionaries. He completed his studies at the Divine Word Seminary in Austria and was ordained there in 1906. During this time Father Aubry knew Father Arnold Jansen, who had founded the Society of the Divine Word in 1875. In fact, he received his appointment to the United States in 1907 from the Founder of the missionary organization.

Father Aubry's first years in America were spent in Iowa where he was engaged in parish work. Then followed a series of administrative positions which brought him to almost all of the Divine Word Seminaries existing at the time. In 1914 he began a six-year term as superior

of the Divine Word Missionaries' American headquarters in Techy, Illinois, the first Catholic mission seminary in the United States. From Techy he went to the Divine Word Seminaries at Girard, Pa., and Duxbury, Mass., again—as local superior.

In 1935 Father Aubry was appointed provincial superior of the American Province, putting him in charge of all the work of the Divine Word Missionaries in the United States, which by the end of his term included some 7 seminaries and 20 parishes in different parts of the country. Since his years as Provincial, Father Aubry has seen the Divine Word Missionaries in the U.S. expand to 4 provinces, 11 seminaries, and over 40 parishes.

After 6 years as provincial superior, Father Aubry became superior of Divine Word Seminary, Conesus, in 1940. His years as superior of the seminary were followed by several years as the director of the Onondha Vineyard and Winery, operated by the seminary.

In recent years Father Aubry has spent an "active retirement" at Divine Word Seminary, Conesus. An eye operation in 1963 restored his falling sight sufficiently so that he could once again read books and papers. Until a year ago he was still directing the League of St. Michael, a spiritual organization which he originated. He is presently compiling a history of the seminary here.
