

Our Lady used it in the Magneificat, Zachariah used it in his Benedictus, Our Lord used it when He cleansed the Temple, when He entered triumphantly into Jerusalem and very strongly when He told us not to imitate Lot's wife who Foved the bridge clubs of Sodom more than the message and warning of an angel. Our Lord asked us to remember that He fed the hungry multitudes but He especially asked that we remember His death on the Cross by making the past present in the Mass, by uprooting that Cross on Calvary and planting it in New York, Tokyo, Saigon and everywhere in the world.

Remember that Our Lord said that He would send the Holy Spirit to recall to our minds all His teachings.
