Fisher Upsets RIT, Bows to Geneseo

Only the setting was changed last Thursday as St. John Fisher College and Rochester Institute of Technology hoopsters repeated an early season surprise, with the Cardinals once again upsetting the heavily favored Tigers in overtime, 70-65, on the Ritter-Clark court. In their first encounter, Fisher triumphed 71-69 on the home floor. Thursday's upset spoiled Tech coach Lou Alexander Jr.'s plans to celebrate his 100th win as RIT's cage mentor (This came later in the week). The Cards led all the way until R.T.'s Ron Russell was fouled by Brendan Carmody with one second of play remaining. Russell's two charity tosses knotted the score at 63-63 to set the stage for the five-minute overtime. For a brief moment Russell looked like the man of the hour as he hit for a quiet goal to open the extra period. From that point on, however, Fisher kept the Tigers scoreless, forcing their opponents into a series of personal fouls and connecting with seven free throws to breeze to victory. Charles and John Fitzgerald, who had 15 and 14, respectively, were the high scorers for Fisher even though fouling out early, topped Tiger scoring with 24 points. EARLIER IN THE WEEK the Cardinals had taken it on the chin for the 16th time this season in a return game with Geneseo, 60-51. In winning the hard fought battle, Geneseo avenged an earlier loss this season to the Cards. The game was a thriller, neck and neck until the closing minutes. Geneseo enjoyed a two-point lead at halftime. In the last three minutes Geneseo spurred ahead, firing three quick baskets to make a sham-bles of Fisher's full-court press. Two games remain on the St. John Fisher schedule. Coach Bobby Wanzer will take his squad to Toronto to meet St. Michael's tomorrow afternoon (Mar. 5). Sunday afternoon at 2:35 p.m. the Cardinals will host Koller at the gymnasium with Siena College of Albany providing the opposition.

Kearney Divides 2

Bishop Kearney's cagers closed their regular schedule last week with a 75-65 win over Hilton and a heart-breaking loss to Franklin, 63-61 in the closing seconds. The Kings ended with a 103 mark. In the Hilton contest, the first half was very close, and only a 40-footer by Scott Shales as the half ended gave Kearney a slim 29-24 lead. Practically doubling their point production in the second half, the Kings scorched the nets for fifty points to outdistance the Hilton squad. Hilton's Red Tide kept it fairly close until the fourth period when Kearney outscored the Cadets 27-19. Spirit overflowing from the crowded stands swept onto the court as Bishop Kearney next opposed the fast-breaking Franklin Red Tide. Battling throughout the contest, the Kings remained neck and neck with a team which had crushed them 104-77 earlier in the season.

McQuaid Clips Monroe

McQuaid's surging basketball forces ripped apart a fast-paced Monroe five, 78-59, in an action-packed encounter last Saturday night at McQuaid. In the Monroe game, Ken Jones' crew exploded for the first nine points on three buckets by Bob Weingartner and a three-point play by Ray Shorbinski. The Redjackets closed to within 16-13 late in the period. Early in the third period the Franklin cagers seized their largest lead, a eleven point bulge, 44-33. Going into the last four minutes of the game, Bishop Kearney closed the gap when Pat Shatzel made it 55-59. Then, Walt Szariacki sunk two foul shots with 52 seconds left tied the game from the corner 59-59. As the seconds disappeared Franklin's Terry Jackson popped in a one hander, added two free throws. Bruce Boss scored two more points, but the buzzer cut off the King's chance to tie. Tom Blake canned two fouls and Shorbinski fired a jumper to put the Knights in command, 20-13.

Geneva Hosts Singing Sisters

Geneva — The Singing Sisters of Syracuse will appear in a concert at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, March 8, at Geneva Theatre, under the sponsorship of the Holy Name Society of St. Francis de Sales parish. The sisters have given performances in Syracuse, Albany, Auburn, Watertown, Binghamton, Utica. They are already booked in many more cities for next year's series of concerts. Some of the songs to be included in their program are: "The Happy Wanderer," Santa Lucia; Hallelujah Amen (Handel); Italian Street Song; Spoonful of Sugar and Chim Chim Cheree (from the Mary Poppins movie); "Onward—Ye Peoples" and novelty arrangements and other features.

Director of the group is Sister M. Eloise, O.S.F. (a Ph.D. from Catholic University), who organized the Singing Sisters. The Singing Sisters consist of 82 teaching sisters from the high schools, elementary schools of the Syracuse diocese, and one nursing sister from St. Joseph's Hospital. Sister M. Terence, is accompanist for the group. Sister Grace Jose is soloist. The concert by the sisters will feature a Hawaiian group of sisters doing native songs; probably the only Barbershop Quartette of nuns in America; the "Whistling Sister," Sister M. Doreen; accordion accompaniment by Sister M. Greta, and saxophone accompaniment by Sister M. Eloise.

An aggressive defense effort by Monroe in the second period kept the game close, but seven quick markers in the late stages upped the home team edge to 13, and the half-time buzzer sounded with McQuaid leading, 38-29. In the 4th canto, McQuaid's Koller got red-hot, led the Knights on a 14-point tear that finished the Redjackets for good. Koller topped the scoring parade with 21 points, Shorbinski collected 15 points, and Weingartner dumped in 14. In the night's first game, McQuaid's J.V.'s dumped the Monroe Junior varsity, 54-41. The Squires finished their season with a 134 record under Mike Griguskis. The McQuaid freshman squad also scored strong with wins over St. Andrew's and Mount Carmel of Auburn, giving the Pages of Brother Thomas Garvey, a 13-5 season.
