'Consistent Discipline' Duty of Fathers

Clifton Springs — "The absence of firm, fair and consistent paternal discipline is one of the worst abuses a father can be guilty of," John Fahy, district principal of the Clifton Springs Central Schools told members of the Holy Name Society of St. Felix Church at their recent banquet.

"If the fathers in this country don't wake up and shake themselves out of their cozy complacency, this sad situation is going to grow into a national disaster of alarming proportions," Mr. Fahy stated. He stressed the importance of fathers playing a dominant role in establishing discipline in the two related items — driving and drinking, which occupy too

Rome — (RNS) — Three priests studying at the Pontifical Gregorian University staged a silent protest against the "womanish" cassock by turning up for classes in dark suits. Their specific target was Canon Law 36 which makes it mandatory for a cleric to wear the cassock wherever it is prescribed as the ordinary attire. This is the case in Italy and other Catholic countries.

Other protesting priests said he knew "only one or two priests in the United States and several other countries who don't feel strongly against the Italian clerical dress."

Other priest-students at the Gregorian University claimed to share the opinions of the dissenting clerical trio. They include Germans, British, Australian and French.

LBJ Reports Prayer Power

Washington — (NC) — President Johnson said here that in facing the burdens of his office he is sustained by prayers—his own and those of his fellow Americans.

Speaking at the Presidential Prayer Breakfast sponsored by International Christian Leadership Mr. Johnson said: "These are the times when I recall the wisdom of that great leader, Abraham Lincoln, when he said, 'I have been driven to my knees when driven by the wisdom that I had nowhere else to go.'"

"But in these troubled times I am sustained by much more than just my own prayers. I am sustained by the prayers of hundreds of other Americans who daily take the time to look up from their own problems to try to help me and encourage me in mine."

The President quoted a letter to him from the mother of a serviceman killed in Vietnam. She said, "We ask God to bless you and your family and to guide you in all the terrible decisions you are called upon to make."

"In those words from that dear little mother are to be found the greatness of this nation and also the strength of its President," Mr. Johnson told his audience of leaders from government, business and labor.
