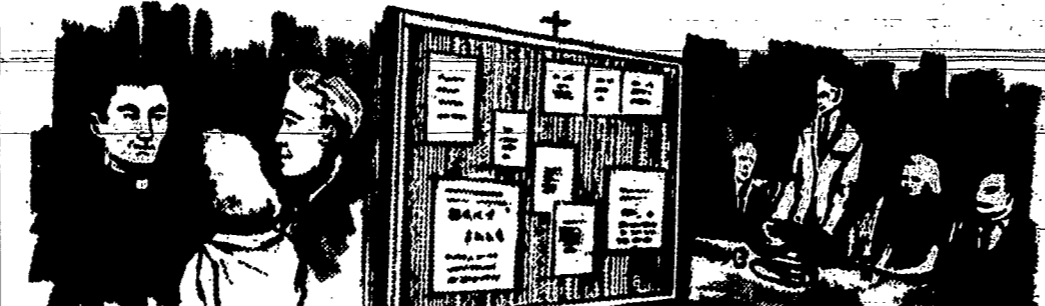


Fashion Show In Auburn
