State Debate Finals Ahead  
Varsity debate teams from Bishop Kearney and Aquinas and Junior Varsity teams from McQuaid Jesuit have qualified for the New York State Forensic League finals to be held in Albany March 25 and 26.  
Varsity results showed Bishop Kearney's affirmative team of senior Mike Critelli and junior Joan Greeffell undefeated while their negative counterparts of juniors Bob Kiggins and Jim Hasenauer lost only one of their four debates to an undefeated Aquinas affirmative. Bishop Kearney's team took first place with 7-1.  
The Aquinas affirmative team of senior Mike Critelli and junior Joan Greeffell defeated Aquinas took the second place spot, and a berth for Albany.  
Junior Varsity teams from McQuaid High School posted one 7-1 record to take one, two positions and qualify for the Albany finals. Juniors John Redman and Tim Collins teamed with Dick Keeley and Jim Welch, sophomores, for first place as the all-sophomore squad of Tom Kostizak, Tom Kay, Pat Hanehan and Leo Pudup secured second place.
