**Scouts Step Up Religious Awards**

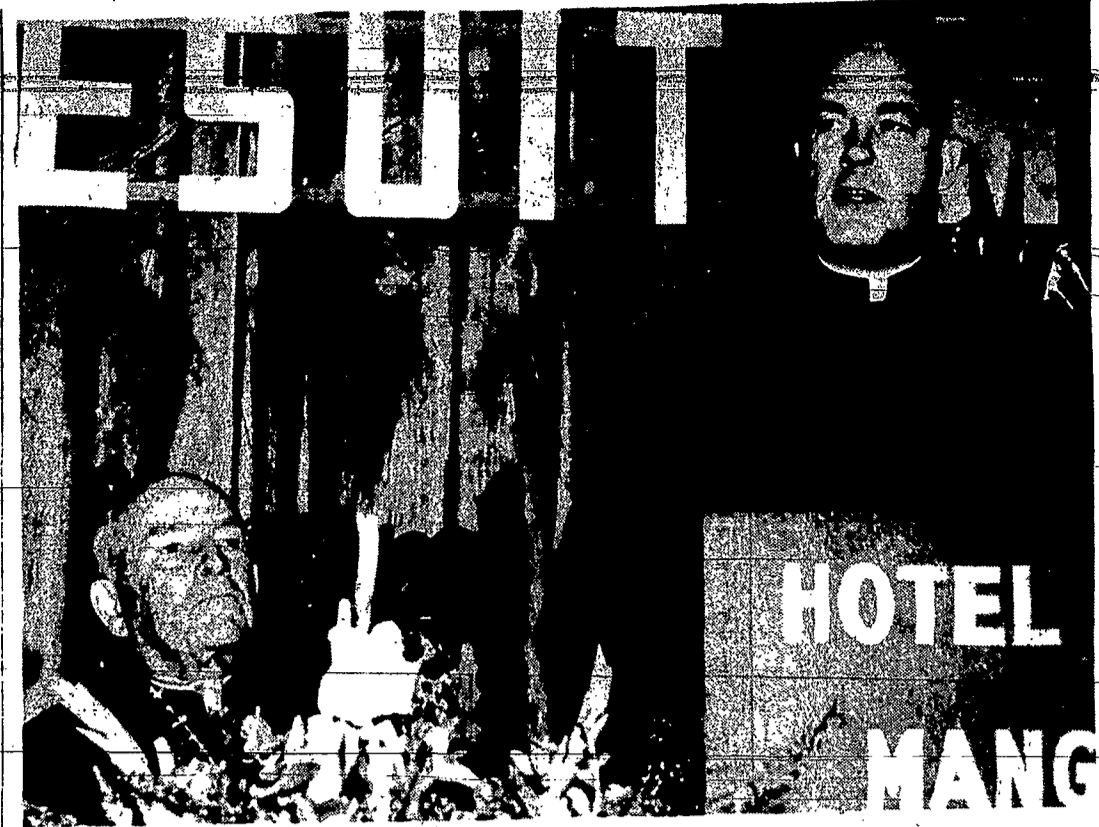

**Dinner Aids Missions**

Jesuit Father Charles F. X. Dolan described the work of Jesuit missionaries in the Caroline and Marshall Islands of the Pacific Ocean at Rochester's first Jesuit Mission benefit dinner Monday evening at the Manger Hotel.

Bishop Kearney urged the nearly 700 who attended the dinner to be aware of the continuing need to help mis-

sionaries in their often lonely outposts of the faith.

Father Dolan explained new efforts of the Jesuit Fathers to make use of native cultures in mission areas in presenting the Catholic faith to these people — as well as extensive educational, medical and technical aid to these same areas.

LeMoyne College president Father William S. Reilly was toastmaster. Sylvester Ziari and Mrs. Joseph Siconolfi were chairmen.

Numerous religious, civic and educational leaders attended the dinner.
