McQuaid Takes Third In State Debate Meet

Nineteen schools from all over New York State journeyed to the state Teachers' College at Oswego, New York, recently for the New York State Forensic League Championships. The state winner, Colton of Buffalo, will represent New York State in the National Championships late in May.

In preliminary elimination contests, both McQuaid Jesuit High School and Bishop Kearney won a berth in the quarterfinals with records of 5-1 and 4-2 respectively. The two Rochester schools met head-on in the quarterfinals, with McQuaid winning a 2-1 decision. This advanced the Jesuit school to the semifinals with three other schools, Jamestown, Carmel, and Colton of Buffalo.

As fate would have it, McQuaid met Colton in the semifinal round. The Buffalo school, which had given McQuaid its only defeat of the tournament thus far, did it again with a 2-1 decision.

At the tournament's end, McQuaid had netted down third place in the state. The McQuaid team was composed of George Northrup, Joseph Combs, Kevin Hennessy, and Christopher Scharf. McQuaid's John Red-
