Cheerleaders from Mt. Carmel High in Auburn came up with two team victories in last Saturday's Invitational Cheerleaders Tournament held at the Rochester C.Y.O. The Auburn ladies took first place awards in the Senior Blue division and the Junior Pink division.

Other winners were Churchville-Chill in the Senior Varsity White division and West Irondequoit in the Junior Yellow bracket.

The Mount Carmel Varsity achieved the highest score of

any team in the tournament—28 points out of a possible 30.

"This is the first time the girls ever scored higher in the finals than they did in the 'yell-offs' (i.e. eliminations)," said Mrs. Mary McGee, the Carmel coach. "They had to do so to win because the competition was so great."

Several car loads of parents, students and faculty members watched the Auburn girls in brown and white win the coveted titles in both divisions for the fourth consecutive year. The Carmel J.V.'s have won six firsts in eight years.

Concerning the trophies won by both teams, Father Kenneth

McElligott, Sports Moderator at Carmel, had this to say:

"These trophies are really just an indication of the tremendous contribution Mrs. McGee has made to Carmel over the years. Besides cheerleading, she has taught gym to every girl since the school opened eleven years ago. Her example and inspiration have cre-

ated one of the best traditions of Mount Carmel High School."

More than 900 girls from Western New York participated in the day-long affair. Grand finale of the action-packed program came in the tournament banquet held in the C.Y.O. auditorium. Ed Meath, Rochester disc jockey, emceed the festivities.

After dinner the top five place teams in each division were announced by Mrs. Helen Smith, tournament director.
