

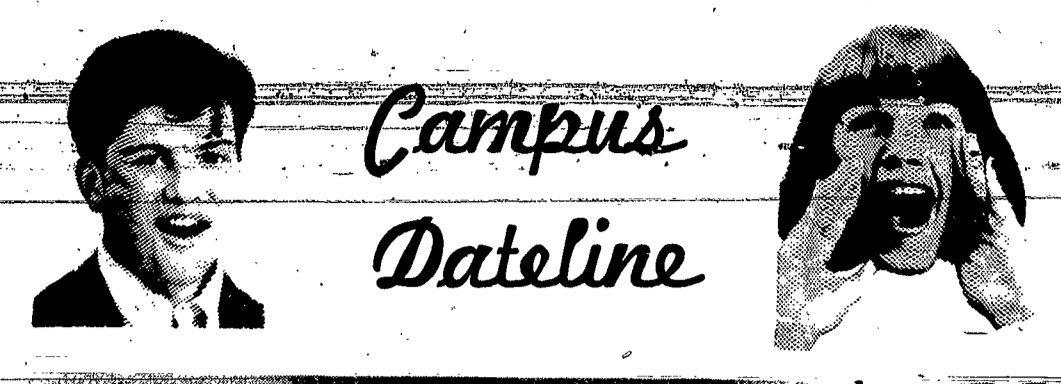

U.S. Over-Abundance Stuns Divine Word Missionary

Father Bernard LeFrois, S.V.D., 57, a Divine Word Missionary, on home leave in Rochester from the Philippines, in describing the tremendous changes he finds after being away for nine years, says he is a little overwhelmed by what he describes as an "over-abundance in everything, here in the Great Society."

"The Filipinos are a very progressive nation, too," he says, "but by comparison the United States is unbelievable. There are superhighways everywhere, never have I seen so many fast automobiles—and the food! No wonder Americans have so many obesity problems—right now, including myself! he laughingly quips.

"I am looking forward to returning to my adopted country, even though our diet here is frugal by your standards and based on rice and bananas, a part of every meal three times a day. You know we have many different kinds of bananas, some are green on the outside and pink inside! Although Visayan is only a mile or so from the sea coast it is terribly hot and you are more comfortable if you eat sparingly."

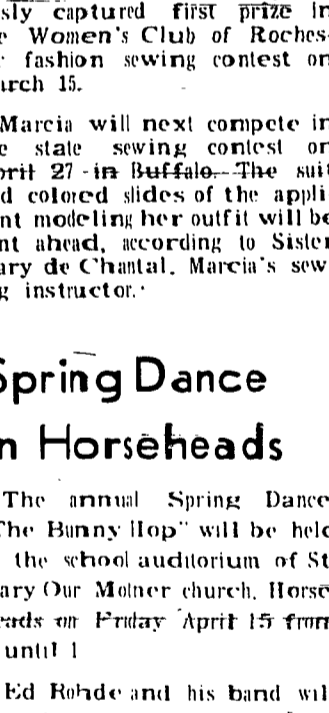

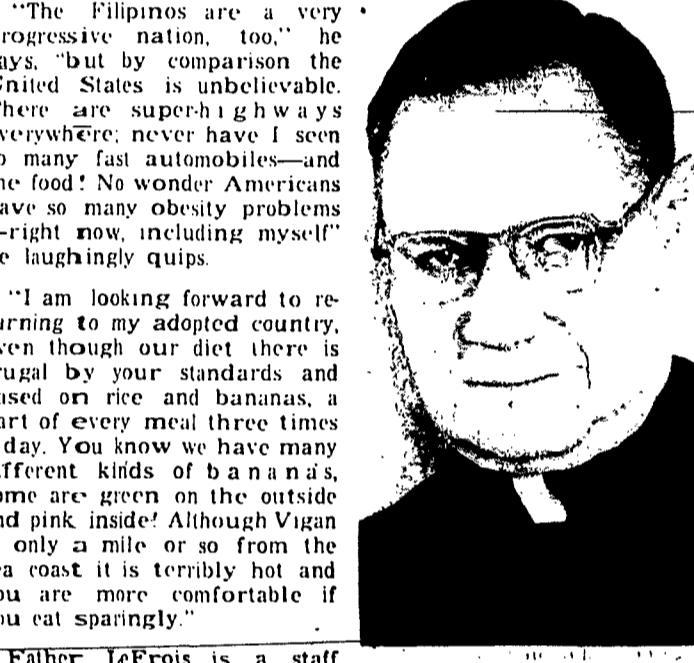

FATHER LE FROIS

Father LeFrois is a staff member at the inter-diocese Major Seminary at Vigan, the province of Ilocos Sur, Philippines. While in the United States, he has traveled extensively throughout the country, giving talks on technical Seminary, as the "alertness" of the part of today's seminarians," Father LeFrois relates.

"In discussing my work in the Philippines, I was astounded by their knowledge of political science and their tremendous awareness of the political and social aspects of Philippine culture. Truly this is a new generation of high intellectual, stimulated, receptive and enthusiastic young men. Many times they would bombard me with questions and we would have to end the discussions for lack of time."

Father LeFrois says he wishes

Father LeFrois, a native of Rochester, studied for six years at Divine Word Seminary, Girard, Pa., and fondly recalls he received his college diploma from Archbishop John Mark Gannon, Erie Diocese. On that occasion the future missionary gave the valedictory address taking his theme from the headlines marking the achievement of Charles Lindbergh who had just flown the Atlantic.

Following his ordination Father LeFrois continued his studies in Rome and taught Sacred Scripture in Germany. In 1940 he returned to the United States and spent 15 years at Divine Word Major Seminary, Techny, Ill., with a one year leave to complete his doctoral work in Sacred Scriptures at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome.

He was assigned to the Philippines in 1956 and since then has been professor of Scripture and allied branches at Vigan and during the summer months
