George Carroll, Newspaperman, Dies at 62

George A. Carroll, Bayside, N.Y. veteran newspaperman and brother of Sister Mary Hilary, R.S.M. of Notre Dame High School, Elmira, died in New York April 2, 1966, after a brief illness.

Carroll, 62, a native of Pompey, N.Y., was a graduate of Syracuse University of Journalism, and served on newspapers in Syracuse and Baltimore before becoming aviation editor of the New York Journal-American in 1945, a position he held until his death.

During World War II he was a lieutenant colonel in the Air Force and was assigned to intelligence work in Alaska.

Besides Sister Mary Hilary, Carroll is survived by his wife, Monte, of Bayside, Long Island, three children, and two brothers, Edward of Pompey, N.Y., and Henry of Syracuse. His youngest son, Hilary, was killed in an auto accident in February.

Funeral was on Wednesday, April 6, in Bayside; burial was to be in Pompey.

Fisher College Ups Tuition

Steadily increasing costs of education have necessitated a tuition increase of \$150 at St. John Fisher College, effective next September.

Annual tuition at the college will be raised from \$1,150 to \$1,300. Room and board for resident students will be increased from \$935 to \$975 per year.

The last previous tuition boost at Fisher went into effect in September 1964. Charges for room and meals did not change at that time.

Announcement of the increase was made by letter from Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, C.S.B., president of the college, to students and their parents.

Father Lavery pointed out that the move was authorized by the Fisher Board of Regents with reluctance, and that the \$150 increment was the absolute minimum necessary to enable the college to meet mounting costs of operation.

Avoid War 'At Any Price' Says Prelate

Verdun — (NC) — The bishop of this site of the bloodiest battle of World War I marked the 50th anniversary of the death of the one million French and German soldiers here with a pastoral declaring that war "must be avoided at any price."

Bishop Pierre Boillon of Verdun declared:

"In sight of these tragic and bleak banks of the Meuse (river), we must state that the worst thing of all is war — that it cannot — it must never be considered as a means of solving men's problems, that it must not be envisioned as a valid solution, no matter what the stakes.

"The mass tomb here, where the remains of the French and the Germans are heaped together helters-skelter, asserts eloquently for the victors and vanquished alike that war is a dreadful venture that must be avoided at any price."
